When Your Friend is Grieving

There are many events in life that can lead to grief: death of a loved one, sudden illness or long-term illness, divorce, loss of a

job or loss of independence. These simple expressions of caring can go a long way in helping someone heal from a significant loss:

- If you don't know what to say, just say. "I'm sorry."
- Offer a brief embrace or touch.
- Keep in touch. Be available but not smothering. Keep visits short at first.
- Accept silence. No need to fill the air with chatter. When your friend is ready to talk, listen.
- Don't probe for details about the death, or illness, or other situation of loss.
- Allow the "working through" process to unfold naturally.
- Offer practical help: cooking, washing dishes, groceries, respite care.
- Encourage postponement of major decisions.
- In time, gently draw him or her into activities.
- When your grieving friend returns to social activities, treat him/her as a normal person.
- Be aware of the normal stages of grief. There is no end date; however, if a mourner or care giver is unable to resolve anger or guilt, suggest seeking help

from a professional counselor or the pastor. We can and should be the face of Christ for our friends and loved ones. Source: Jeanetta Chrystie

RESPONSE Moment - Give

GIVE by Cynthia Rivers, Vice President of the United Methodist Women Board of Directors

Ms. Rivers encourages us to be faithful in our giving so as to live out our purpose, remembering our past and laying support for the future. One of the ways we do this is by being disciplined in our giving through the five giving channels. They are your individual pledges, the World Thank offering, Gift in Memory, Gift to Mission, and Special Mission Recognition. (Under the leadership of treasurer Harriett McMahill, this is something our unit has done for many years.)

Ms. Rivers gives an example of these funds helping to supply Thanksgiving food baskets to many connected with the Dallas Bethlehem Center. An emergency grant from the United Methodist Women also provided two new air conditioners to the center so the children's summer program could continue. This is just one example of many. Consider the \$1,000.00 BOLD grant received right here at Cedar Falls First United Methodist Church directed to our youth group.

Ms. Rivers continues and I quote, "May each of us take ownership of our Mission Giving with renewed pride and commitment, knowing that together we can change lives. May we be bold as we influence the giving in our units, districts and conferences to support Mission Giving helping women, children and youth not just in our own communities but around the world." Inside the church was a group of 25 members of FEFEME spinning sheep and alpaca wool into yarn, and knitting, and making clothes and textiles. They learned the textile skills at FEFEME workshops.

Copa says the skill building workshops were started 20 years ago, and it now hosts workshops in most of the church's 14 districts, about 17 or 18 times a year. The workshops are mostly on sewing and knitting and they also help to build independence and confidence. Santusa Mamani de Luna is a 50 year old woman who lives with her husband, daughter, son-in-law, and three grandchildren. Once a housekeeper, she now makes twice as much sewing and selling polleras, a type of skirt. She is able to stay at home and take care of her family. de Luna thanks the Lord for giving her self-esteem and the ability to share with others which she does as she travels to other districts teaching what she has learned. Berta Mamani, a single mother of four worked as a mason before attending the workshops. She now makes and sells sweaters, skirts, and coats. which provides her a more constant income. She hopes that her children will be able to finish their studies.

Other stories of the success of these indigenous people can be found in the issue of RESPONSE in the church library. It also speaks of the Methodist missionaries and their part in the development of Bolivia.

April Mission Focus: Midwest Mission Distribution Center

Midwest Mission Distribution Center is located in Chatham, Illinois (just south of Springfield). The center's function is to enable immediate and effective responses to disasters, especially in the Upper Midwest. It is a facility to receive, hold, process, and maintain a ready supply of material goods for emergency response and critical ongoing needs.

MMDC is part of the United Methodist Committee On Relief Supply Network, and often gives UMCOR supplies to respond to disasters both within the United States and abroad as they see fit. It is one of seven centers in the UMCOR Relief Supply Network – and the closest one to Iowa. MMDC makes, collects, and stores many disaster relief supplies such as cleaning buckets, personal dignity kits or health kits, layettes, and school kits or school bags. In addition, they make school desks to ship overseas, and restore and send bicycles and sewing machines to places that rely on them for transportation and income. This ministry it is sustained by volunteers who receive, sort, pack, and ship the goods. The center functions in concert with the needs of UMCOR for goods prepared by volunteers.

Donations are particularly important to a non-profit organization like MMDC. MMDC has no indebtedness, and works off of the monetary donations and supplies that are received. MMDC works hard to find the lowest deals through suppliers and can often get supplies three times cheaper than in a local store.



WeeCare - our Gap Ministry with LoveINC

Wee Care is First UMC's way of showing that we care about the little ones in our community. We've supported and hosted this ministry since July of 2011, and it is one of the most heavily used gap ministries with Love In the Name of Christ.

So, how can you help?

Baby supplies for our Love INC Wee Care ministry are always appreciated. Baby wash, baby lotion, diapers in all sizes, pacifiers, teething gel, diaper rash ointment, burp cloths, receiving blankets, bottles (4 and 8 oz) and sippy cups can always be used. Seasonal clothing is also helpful to have on hand, and parents are grateful for the cute new clothes or warm jackets. Of course, if you see a good deal on end-of-season baby clothes feel free to bring them in. We have a place to store them until the appropriate season. We cannot accept baby powder or any baby foods (or formula or pedialyte).

If you are not a shopper, you can make a monetary donation and we will purchase the supplies most needed. Checks can be made to FUMC, with "Wee Care" on the memo line. Thank you for your ongoing support of our WeeCare program.

Be a Blessing to Someone - Love INC

People in need will often approach a church for assistance. Unfortunately, many churches are not equipped to meet the variety of needs that are presented. That's not a failure of the churches - at their core, they are faith organizations, not relief agencies. But, the Christian imperative is to help. Love INC works like this: when someone approaches a member church for assistance, they are referred to Love INC. Love INC then conducts an interview to fully determine the need, and which church is best able to assist. Love In The Name of Christ (Love INC) pools the strengths of area churches and agencies to reach out to those in need - our church is one of over 30 that partner with Love INC.


