God Chooses YOU

Matthew 26:36-41

Then Jesus went with his disciples to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to them, "Sit here while I go over there and pray." He took Peter and the two sons of Zebedee along with him, and he began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me."

Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will."

Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. "Couldn't you men keep watch with me for one hour?" he asked Peter. "Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

I have the best intentions when I pray at night. I have the best intentions to lift the concerns of the day up to our God who is always ready to listen. But truth be told, I often fall asleep somewhere between Dear God and Amen.

Can you relate?

I know the disciples could relate, the same thing happened to them. Jesus invited them out to the Garden of Gethsemane to sit with him while he prayed. I believe they had the best intentions, but they fell asleep, not just once, but twice. Jesus was facing the most difficult time of his life, and his best friends couldn't even stay awake to be there for him. As a matter of fact, they failed him time and time again as he faced his crucifixion. They scattered when he was arrested. They acted like they didn't know him at his trial. There is evidence that most of them were not present as he hung on the cross. And when he arose from the dead, they were hiding behind locked doors. Yet Jesus came to them, he spoke words of peace to them and gave them the power and authority to make disciples, baptizing them in his name.

That gives me hope. It gives me hope that Christ will still use me, even when I disappoint him. Like I said, sometimes I fall asleep when I should be praying. Sometimes I run and hide when I should be fighting for justice, sometimes I act like I don't know Jesus when things get tough. Sometimes my flesh is so weak even though my spirit is willing.

Can you relate?

Here is the good news, God knows that, and God chooses and uses us anyway. God comes to us when, in fear and anguish, we can't find our way to God. God speaks words of peace into our fears. And God gives us the same power and authority to make disciples in the world today.

This Easter season don't let your shortcomings and sin keep you from sharing the joy of this season. God has always used imperfect human beings to share the good news of Jesus Christ with the world.

Even our best intentions are nothing compared to God's love for us displayed on the cross.

Barbara Pershing and Karen Page provided an overview of the scope of what this group accomplishes and how they make it all happen. This group has been very busy over the past several years making quilts that are gifted to foster children,



Lincoln school children, and children being adopted. They are also gifted at Baptisms, for Grief support, for Veterans and folks needing Comfort Care, and for the Mission Ingathering, the Quilt Auction, and Midwest Missions. The group also makes school bags for Ingathering kits and puts together feminine hygiene kits for The Days for Girls project.

It is not unusual for 20 people to come on Tuesdays to assist with the many projects. Some people cut fabric, some sew, some quilt by hand and some quilt with a machine. There are many "jobs" for anyone who wants to participate and support this important mission of FUMC. The most important aspect of this group is relationships. There is always a need for durable/sturdy fabric to make school bags and other stitching projects. The



American Guild of Organists Concert

The music department is thrilled to announce, the Cedar Valley Chapter of the "American Guild of Organists" will host a concert in our sanctuary on April 23rd at 4pm. This concert will feature guild organists of various ages and abilities. It will also pay tribute to our dear friend, Doug Shaffer. For nearly a decade, Doug served as music director and organist in our church. Doug retired from his music director duties in August of 2019. Even after his cancer diagnosis, Doug continued his music ministry as organist until he fully retired in July of 2021. Sadly, Doug passed away this past December. As a teacher, and mentor, he made it his mission to help younger musicians discover their own passion for music and advance their skills. This concert is free and in-person only.



About Our Casavant Pipe Organ

The First UMC Casavant Opus 3669 pipe organ was installed and dedicated in 1989. A committee, including Terry Kroese, spent many years designing, and planning the beautiful instrument we now have. Our organ was built in a factory in Canada before it was installed in its current home in the Sanctuary. Ours is one of three Casavant organs in Cedar Falls and Waterloo.

Our organ has a total of 1,511 individual pipes. They are all housed in the front of the chancel area. Some are visible; others are further back in the organ chamber. It has 27 ranks of pipes. Each rank consists of 61 pipes for the manuals and 32 for the foot pedals and correspond to several keys on those keyboards. The stops, visible above the keyboard, allow the organist to create different combinations of sounds or effects. The pipes are made

of various metals and wood, which range in size from sixteen feet to approximately one inch. The larger the pipe, the lower the sound. Many of the pipes were designed to appear spotted for a beautiful visual effect.

Only a few organists have had the honor and privilege to serve God and the congregation of First UMC on this organ.

Celebrating the Bell Choirs 50th!

At Christmas 1972, fifty years ago, we celebrated the birth of our savior with a type of music we hadn't heard before – the clean, clear sound of perfectly-tuned handbells.

On a borrowed set of bells, our senior pastor's wife, Betty Jo Wilcox, along with sons Dan and Paul, introduced us to a whole new genre of sacred music.

The next year, we bought our own handbells and several choirs were formed with Betty Jo directing them. The bell choir's mission was straightforward, "to

ring for the glory of God".

Ringing in a bell choir is a unique musical experience, and over the years we have had hundreds of people participate. Almost anyone can learn to do it.

In the early years, our ringers would travel to bell choir festivals, where they would learn from other ringers, perform in concerts, and ring together in massed choirs that filled entire arenas. Those festivals were often long-distance road trips on charter buses, with plenty of fun and sightseeing along the way.

We have been blessed to have talented and passionate directors for our bell choirs: Betty Jo Wilcox, Jenine Enwright, Randy Hogancamp, Cyndi Sweet, Brenda Mark, Noelle Stow, Joe Bohr, and our two current directors Aaron Hansen and Nancy Standafer. Under their leadership, our bell choirs have earned a reputation for pushing the boundaries of what is possible on handbells.

General Conference Postponed

No one will be compelled or required to act contrary to their convictions, understanding of scripture, or conscience. Likewise, no one will be prevented from doing the ministry God is calling them to offer."


