The 2024 General Conference is set to occur April 23 – May 3, 2024, and is a significant event, postponed due to COVID-19. Here are some key ways to engage in this pivotal gathering.

1) PRAY

Commit to praying for the General Conference, the lay and clergy delegates, the volunteers, and for discernment. Use the updated Upper Room prayer guide specific to General Conference 2024 to guide your prayers. (https://www.resourceumc.org/-/media/ umc-media/2024/03/14/16/33/guidetoprayer_gc24_english-c.pdf)

2) STAY INFORMED AND UNDERSTAND THE PROCESS

Access information from reliable news services, such as the Daily Digest from the United Methodist News Service and ResourceUMC. The United Methodist News Service offers knowledgeable coverage of the complexities and developments within The United Methodist Church, ensuring accurate and current information.

General Conference, comprising 862 clergy and lay delegates from many parts of the globe, is the sole authoritative voice of The United Methodist Church. Its procedures can be intricate and nuanced in ways that are not always noted by outside news agencies. (https://www.umnews.org/en/landing-pages/general-conference-news-and-commentary)

3) ENGAGE IN DIALOGUE

Participate in discussions with your pastors and General Conference delegations. These discussions are invaluable for expressing concerns, asking questions, and hearing diverse perspectives. Join us on Wednesday Fusions in April to be informed and engaged. Join us at Fusion on Wednesday, April 17 to learn more.

4) BUILD TRUST

Focus on cultivating trust within our congregation. We have a history here at First of building trust through crucial conversations, encouraging deep listening and emphasize the importance of listening to understand, rather than to respond.

By approaching General Conference 2024 with prayer, education, open dialogue, and a focus on discipleship we can navigate this significant event with faith, hope, and unity.

The event will be held on Saturday, April 13 from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Cedar Falls First United Methodist Church.
