# August Mission of the Month

### **Midwest Missions**

Our Monthly Mission for August is Midwest Missions. Our goal is to send 300 School Kits and 100 Personal Dignity Kits to the Midwest Mission Distribution Center. There they will collect and disperse these kits all over the USA and overseas. We will also need monetary donations to mail the kits.

### School supplies for School Kits

- 3 8 x 10 ½ spiral-bound one-subject notebooks, 70-80 pgs each (wide OR college rule)
- 1 pencil sharpener (hand held at least 1" long)
- 6 unsharpened pencils with erasers
- 1 box 24 crayons (ONLY 24 count, please)
- 1 box of 12 colored pencils
- 1 pair BLUNT scissors (rounded tip metal blade)
- 1 2 inch or larger eraser
- 1 12 inch/30 centimeter ruler (hard or flexible, must be flat and have metricmarkings)

Some of these supplies are on sale right now so it's a great time to add a few items to your shopping cart.

### Personal Dignity Kits

- 1 Bath Hand Towel No kitchen towels
- 1 Bath Washcloth No dishcloths
- 1 Adult Toothbrush No multipacks
- 1 Bar Soap 3-4 oz
- 1 Shampoo 15-18 oz
- 1 Deodorant 2-3 oz stick, roll on, or pump
- 1 1-gal Resealable Plastic Bag

### Kit Contains:

- \$2 donation for razor and toothpaste
- All items must be NEW & placed in a 1-gal resealable plastic bag

It's not necessary to provide the entire kit. If you are willing to donate some of supplies, kind people at our church will assemble bags for the Ingathering in November.
