

Christmas Through the Gospels

Have you ever been brave enough to go through old boxes in your basement? We moved to Cedar Falls two years ago and there are boxes downstairs that have not been touched since the movers dropped them. As I was rummaging through some of those this past

week, I came across an envelope of old pictures. I was taken back to a time when I weighed less, had more hair, and far less responsibility in life! I found pictures of when I used to play baseball, my senior prom, and my faithful childhood dog, Buddy.

Some say that a picture is worth a thousand words. Perhaps that is true. Whenever I look at old photos, it invites me to journey back in time. When I gaze upon that moment captured in print, the picture retells the story.



Though the ancient world did not have

flash photography, we have the gift of the scriptures. Just as a picture retells a story of a moment in time, the Gospel narratives contained in the bible give us a snapshot into the life of Jesus who lived 2,000 years ago.

Preach It, Brothers and Sisters

The United Methodist Church is very clear in its doctrine that ministry is a partnership between ordained clergy and us, the laity. We all have skills and gifts that are useful in service to the cause of Christ. Among the laity, some of us can serve in ministries of music, the Congregational Care Team, and any of our First UMC missions.

We even have a crew of lay-speakers who help other churches with worship leadership. This group, known as the Circuit Riders, is currently supplying worship leadership to the United Methodists of Frederika and New Hope Parrish (Dumont & Aredale). On any given Sunday, at least two members of CF First UMC are on the road, leading prayers and delivering sermons in these churches.

Serving in this way is an exciting opportunity for us to meet other Iowa United Methodists and to assist them in maintaining their Sunday services in the absense of a regular pastor.

Many, but not all, of our Circuit Riders are graduates of the School For Lay Ministry. All have a heart for worship and for sharing stories of faith that others may find useful in their lives.

Chris Congdon in our First UMC media office says this, "A goal of most churches is to equip and encourage people in their own lives of ministry. I love that our church actually provides a pathway for those whose gifts are in the spoken ministries of telling the stories of the Gospel."

We can always use a few more Circuit Riders. If this ministry sounds interesting to you, talk to Chris Congdon about exploring further.



A Forever Gift

The Way Forward

See the world like Jesus does. Dive into God's word and the story of his work on the earth. Learn to live your life with eternal significance and purpose.


This course is an in-depth look into the Christian Commission to go into the world with the Gospel message, until the whole world hears.

Get Into the Spirit of Christmas



For many years in the Lee's Summit, Missouri area, an anonymous benefactor doled out \$100 bills to the needy each Christmas. After he found out that a tabloid newspaper was going to reveal his name, Larry Stewart, a successful businessman, revealed his identity and told how the practice began.

In the winter of 1971, Stewart was working as a door-to-door salesman. The company he was working for went out of business, and he quickly ran out of money. Stewart hadn't eaten in two days when he went to the Dixie Diner and ordered a breakfast he eventually admitted he couldn't pay for. Ted Horn, the restaurant owner, sympathized with Stewart. Horn acted as though he found a \$20 bill on the floor underneath Stewart's chair. "Son, you must have dropped this," Horn said.

"It was like a fortune to me." Stewart reflected. "I said to myself, 'Thank you, Lord.' Right then I made a promise. I said, Lord, if you ever put me in a position to help other people, I will do it."

Over the years, Stewart estimates that he has given away around \$1.3 million. He says he has been amply rewarded in return. "I see the smiles and looks of hopelessness turn to looks of hope in an instant," he says. "After all, isn't that what we're put here on earth for-to help one another?"

Stephen Ministers aren't handing out \$100 bills to people at Christmas, or any other time of the year. But they are committed to helping other people through difficult times in other ways. If you would like someone to come alongside to listen and care for you during this holiday season and beyond, this group is ready to help. We have sent many Bibles to prison and they are treasured by those who receive them. Each Bible costs \$10.

Wee Care

Grateful parents of wee ones come to our church every Tuesday afternoon to pick up a supply of much needed baby goods, such as diapers, bottles and sippy cups, lotions and baby wash and wipes. This gap ministry through LoveINC helps struggling families stretch their dollars.

Change a Child's Story

Research indicates that a quarter of kids who are behind in reading by the 4th grade will eventually drop out of school, making them more likely to experience other hardships. To address this, we have partnered with our neighbor, Lincoln Elementary School, to provide Reading Buddies for K-3rd grade and have purchased books for every student at Lincoln School. Your donation to this cause will buy books for our young friends at Lincoln School.

Hospitality House


