

Are We There Yet?

The season of Advent is a highlight of any congregation's life. It is a time of joy, color, light, and anticipation. And it is a time of worship. This is a season that calls us to fall to our knees in worship of the awesome God. Advent is the season where we remember that God chose to put on flesh and dwell among us. God reached down from incomprehensible heights to touch the life we live. And God chose to be born in the humblest of ways, in a manger, in a barn, or a cave, or on the side of the road. The Creator God Almighty crying in the prickly hay, fodder for animals. There is no proper response, other than worship.

At the same time, Advent is a reminder that there is more to come, that we are on a journey toward a new reality, a new way of being. Advent, from the Latin "venio" – coming and "ad" – to, is more about what is next than what was before. It is less a remembrance of the first coming and more an anticipation of the completion of the promised kingdom. Yet, the seeds of the return and reign of Christ were planted in the first coming, which is why the power of Christmas is so strong. Our constant struggle is to pay attention to the need of the church to anticipate the return of Christ and the fulfillment of the promised kingdom, when our congregation is longing to celebrate Christmas and all the beauty and tradition and sentiment of that season–especially since our culture has been pushing Christmas on us for months now. So, how do we live in the balance? How do we anticipate what is to come, even as we celebrate the traditions and the excitement and the wonder that is Christmas?

The pastors invite you to join us on a journey this Christmas.

Journeying together this Advent+ season will be the whole family of God, the ones who occupy the seats beside you as you gather together for this shared experience. Present and not present, these are the ones who occupy your minds and hearts as you seek this new place, this new way of being together. Invariably, when you travel together, some are more anxious than others. Some may



prefer to stay where they are. Others are so hopeful of what is to come that they may begin to overwhelm the rest. Some just want the journey to be over. Others are content to enjoy the ride. Journeys impact us in different ways. But even with the best of intentions and the joy of community, it won't be long before someone says, "Are we there yet?"

This season, let that question not be a whine from an uncomfortable back seat or an impatient traveler; let it be a plea for God to break into our reality and bring us the glorious fulfillment of the promise; let it be a hope that God remains in charge, despite the trouble we see in the landscape through which we travel; let it be a call to work and worship in this season of light.

First UMC Live Online

The whole world - including you - can watch our Sunday sermons live, online at our First UMC facebook page. The video stream for Transformation worship starts around 8:55, and the Traditional worship stream starts around 10:25. Please, if you can't make it in-person, consider watching on Facebook!

Also, be aware that this means there are live cameras in our worship spaces. Our cameras are usually positioned to show



only the morning's speaker, but it is possible that the congregation may also appear in the livestream. If, for any reason you wish to ensure that you do not appear on-camera, please ask our camera operator for a safe place to sit.



The Warmth of a Family

November 22 was National Adoption Day, and at the Black Hawk County Courthouse, 26 children and youth were legally adopted into 17 families. It's an annual event which recognizes the love and acceptance of adoptive parents, and celebrates that the children have found a permanent place in a forever family. Many adoptive children have led lives of uncertainty, and formal adoption brings a sense of stability and belonging. It's a milestone in their lives.

Our First UMC Quilters and Stitchers were there. In one of the quietest, but most moving, missions of our church, the Quilters gave each of the 26 kids a hand-made quilt. For some of them, it may be one of just a few things that they can call their own. When you consider the time and effort it takes to make a quilt, it is a very special gift, indeed.

Reduce Your Taxes With A Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA

Did you know that you can reduce your taxes by making a gift directly from your IRA to our church? An IRA gift is a simple and easy way for you to use your IRA to support your favorite ministry.

If you are age 70 ½ or older, you are likely familiar with the IRA required minimum distributions. Each year the IRS requires you to withdraw a certain amount from your IRA whether you need the funds, or not. And, you pay income tax on every distribution you take. For many IRA account holders, the taxes can be a significant and undesirable annual burden.

Many people are discovering that they can make a big difference to help their church with an IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution. The IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution provides several benefits. It allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 annually from your IRA directly to charitable organizations. You do not include the distribution in your taxable income, nor are you allowed to deduct the amount as a charitable contribution. You can count the gift as part of your required minimum distribution, which lowers your income and your taxes. This method of charitable giving is especially beneficial for those who do not itemize their tax deductions

How to make an IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution

To make an IRA charitable gift, simply contact your IRA custodian and request that an amount be transferred to the First United Methodist Church of Cedar Falls, Iowa. Also, please contact Sue Chizek, the Church's Finance Manager and alert her that a gift is coming from your IRA.

Can I use this same method to make a gift to the Church's Endowment Fund?

Yes. You can use the Qualified Charitable Distribution to make a gift to the Endowment Fund. For an added benefit, consider designating First UMC as a beneficiary of your IRA. Please contact your financial and tax professionals to see how a Qualified Charitable Distribution may benefit you.

What Are Apportionments?

If you pay attention to church finances, you know that "apportionments" are 17% of our budget. Apportionments are the dollars that we send on to the larger United Methodist organization to cover "our share" of things like:

- Iowa Conference Office
- Board of Ordained Ministry, ensures the integrity of our clergy
- Board of Global Ministries, our structure for worldwide missions
- Board of Higher Education, educates and empowers clergy and laity for ministry
- UMCOR, our humanitarian relief organization
 - UM Communications, provides for the sharing of resources, news and stories

Chiquita Loveless serves as the Director for Military and Veteran Student Services at UNI including 13 women and 287 male veterans and dependents. Yolando Loveless, her husband of 34 years, currently serves as the Executive Director of the Black Hawk County VA. Chiquita has served in the U.S. Navy for more than 23 years. She was the first African American to serve on a ship. Both Chiquita and Yolando served in the US Navy Order of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

They are passionate about helping veterans and take great pride in being veterans. Their future goals are breathtaking. They want to see more veterans participate in church worship and to keep praying; continue Operation Christmas (similar to our Angel Tree program); provide for nursing homes (last year our quilters donated 13 quilts that were shared in local nursing homes); and to share love. They are blessed with a new 3500 square foot facility and deciding how to utilize the space.

Chiquita and Yolando have spent their lives serving others. We all walked away from the meeting remembering how much our veterans have given for our freedom and are forever grateful.

Cedar Valley Angels - Love Box Program

Our Christmas Eve mission focus is a new one for First UMC: Cedar Valley Angels. CVA is an organization which provides support to the children and families in the foster-care system.

The Need:

Children are removed from their homes and placed in foster care due to neglect, abandonment, or because they are the victim of physical, sexual, or emotional abuse. When

children are removed from the home, they are confused and upset, and they need the temporary protection and nurturing that a foster family can provide.

But placing a child in foster care is not the end of the story. Foster families often find their resources stretched further than they expected, and the demands of parenting a foster child often stress other family relationships. Consider:

- Nationally, 50% of the homeless population spent time in foster care
- only about 50% of those who age-out of the foster system will graduate high school


It is clear that both the foster kids and the foster families can use some additional support.

The Solution:

We know that trauma can be healed in the context of healthy, supportive relationships. Cedar Valley Angels' Love Box program provides foster families with community and holistic support so that they can continue to do the important and meaningful work of being a foster parent. This December, we're directing our mission efforts to the CVA's Love Box program, and we encourage you to give generously. Love Box support includes: enrichment activities, encouraging notes. gift cards, household supplies, groceries, clothing, mentorship, and a supportive community.

We also encourage you to consider becoming a Love Box volunteer. Volunteers make up a Love Box group, which will be matched with a local foster family based on compatibility and scope of needs. Being a Love Box volunteer is a one-year committment to be present in the life of a foster family. When our families are matched with committed volunteers who show up monthly, parents feel more supported and children gain a greater sense of belonging and self-confidence.

SoDA Volunteers

Would you be interested in becoming a Social Determinants Advocate (SoDA) Volunteer? A SoDA is a specially trained volunteer who works in a clinic or doctor's office to help patients who have identified some needs or barriers to staying healthy. Issues commonly identified are ability to afford medications, lack of transportation, of access to healthy food or services. The Social Determinants Advocates assist patients to navigate the system and connect with services that can help them. You don't have to have a healthcare background but it can help to have some familiarity with the health system. Martha Kroese currently works as a SoDA and can share her experience if you are interested. You would receive 15-18 hours of training, much of which focuses on community resources. Generally, the SoDAs are scheduled in the clinic once a week for about 3-4 hours at time.
