Valentine's Day has always been an important holiday for both of us. I learned very quickly in our marriage that forgetting Valentine's Day was right up there with forgetting our anniversary and Janet's birthday. These are the "holy trinity" of keeping a marriage together, and staying out of the dog house. For the record, Valentine's Day is named after a third-century Roman Catholic martyr, St. Valentine.

I typically shower Janet with flowers, candy, a beautiful Hallmark card that reflects my love and dinner out on Valentine's Day. Humorous cards are out for this day, and dinner must be at a very special restaurant. It is not so much that Janet expects these things; she has never

been challenging or difficult. She is very loving and understanding life partner. I do it because . . . I love her, and want to demonstrate it on a very important day. "To I do as other lovers do."

This year we begin Lent with Ash Wednesday falling on Valentine's Day. We also finish with Easter falling on April Fools' Day. Interesting, right? The last time this happened was in 1945. So Christian couples may celebrate their love on Ash Wednesday with smudges of ash on their foreheads, and pull a prank on each other on Easter. (Don't tell Janet, but the first thing on Easter morning I'm going to run to the window and shout, "Holy cow, it snowed 12 inches last night!"... "April fools!")

To start Lent on Valentine's Day is very appropriate. We will be celebrating Ash Wednesday, and receive ashes in the sign of a cross. The cross is a reminder of the death Jesus endured for us. Crucifixion was a horrible way to die, and yet the cross is one of the most prolific symbols of love. We journey through Lent recalling the events that led Jesus to be crucified. He came into the world to shed light on love and hope, but at every step there were those who willingly tried to put out that light. He brought grace and forgiveness, but his gifts were often rejected by those filled with hatred and fear.

It may seem quirky that Easter falls on April Fool's Day this year. God was not "fooling around" when he sent his son, Jesus to demonstrate his love, but he pulled the greatest joke of all time on the first Easter! Imagine what Satan and those who sought to kill Jesus thought when they discovered an empty tomb. It truly made them look "foolish" in thinking they won in silencing Jesus forever by crucifying him. Victory over death, hope burns brightly, and love wins! Maybe we should leave one of our Easter eggs empty this year on April Fool's Day to remind us of the empty tomb because "Jesus is not here, he has risen!"

Come to the Cross - Lent 2018

Ash Wednesday Communion & Worship -Wednesday, February 14

7:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall


We invite you to "Come to the Cross" to renew your faith this Lent. Ash Wednesday, February 14 marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is the season we remember Jesus' sacrifice of love on the Cross. For the six weeks leading to Easter we will be focusing on the Cross of Christ.

Our Ash Wednesday Service will be held in the Fellowship Hall again this year. This will give us an opportunity to have the cross lifted high in the center of our room. This will remind us that the Cross is the center of our attention this Lent. All who come for worship will be seated around the cross. Music will be soft and solemn remembering the journey Jesus took to the Cross.

The service will include communion and the imposition of ashes. Communion reminds us what Christ endured out of love for us on the Cross. When we share in the cup and bread we

are reminded of his body broken and the blood he shed for us. The imposition of ashes is an ancient ritual that dates back to the church's early beginnings. The sign of the cross with ashes will be offered on the forehead or hand to those attending. The ashes are made from the palms used from our last Palm Sunday service a year ago.

Ash Wednesday will be a meaningful way to begin your Lenten Journey of Faith. This journey passes through the Upper Room and Garden of Gethsemane, then leads to the cross and concludes with the celebration of our risen Lord on Easter.





You are invited to go deeper into your faith during the season of Lent as we embark on a 6 week study of the Apostles' Creed. This 6 week study will be kick off Wednesday, February 21st in the library at 6:00pm. The sessions will be guided by video and insights from Pastor Matt as well as group discussion. Ever since the second Temple was destroyed in



Our group of travelers will be taking prayers from our congregation to the Western Wall. We will pray over the prayer requests while standing at the base of the wall, and place them in the cracks. Beginning with Ash Wednesday there will be a table near the Welcome Center for you to place your prayers. All prayers will be held in confidence.

A Letter From Our Finance Committee

January 2018

Dear Members and Friends of First United Methodist Church of Cedar Falls, We are glad to report that in 2017, we were able to finish the year in the black with a carryover of \$12,717. Thank you very much! The financial support you provide is an important demonstration of your gratitude for God's many blessings.

The budgeting process has become more challenging with each passing year. We are an active church and strive to remain that way, but the gap between our annual budget and what our congregation will realistically support has grown.

In 2018 we will be facing a financial challenge as our pledges are down nearly \$90,000 from 2017. A year ago at this time we had 254 pledges totaling \$718,985, and this year our total is 247 pledges for \$629,545. Much of the decline can be attributed to the deaths of some generous givers, and others moving from our community.

The budget for 2018 is \$860,955. This represents a \$5,000 reduction from last year, and a \$52,000 reduction over the past five years.

While the year is still early, we are calling together the leadership of our congregation to begin planning to face this financial challenge. It will require us to look seriously at making changes in our budget. We promise to stay in touch with the congregation. Once again, we thank you for your generosity. We are excited to report that our building loan balance is down to \$453,934. In 2017, we were able to accomplish so much in the name of Christ because of the generous support of people like you. Your gifts do make a difference in supporting our programs and ministries in our church, our community, and around the world. Together we are doing great things in serving Christ through our church.

Weekly Budget Reporting

Our Finance Committee believes the 2018 budget to be an accurate picture of the financial needs of the church and wants you to have current information on our financial status. Income is fairly easy to report, as we know what we get when we get it. Expenses are another story, however, as billing sometimes lags behind the goods and services that we purchase. It can sometimes take a couple of weeks before we are able to "close the books" on a month of operations. We want your information to be more current than that.

You'll notice a new financial reporting format in your weekly Sunday bulletins. It will include income as of the previous week, as well as a pro-rated budget "needs" amount, and it will be very easy to see if we are running ahead or behind our projected financial needs. Here is an example from the January 28 Sunday bulletin:



Creed: noun $\$ ' kr·d $\$ a statement of the basic beliefs of a religion; an idea or set of beliefs that that guides the actions of a person or group.

Did you know that you are a theologian? You don't have to be a pastor to be one either! Theology is simply the study of God, our ultimate beliefs, and the relationship between the two. Everyone has an ultimate set of beliefs about God whether they



believe in God or not. So I ask you as a fellow theologian, "What do you really believe?"

What does it mean when we say I believe? How do our ultimate beliefs shape our everyday life? What is the source of our beliefs? At the end of the day, why does it matter? I don't know about you but what I believe shapes every aspect of my life. It effects the way I see right and wrong, how I parent, how I view my spouse, and what I do with my time and money. My beliefs have impacted many of my decisions. Because of my beliefs I have said yes to some things and no to others.

For Christians, the beliefs expressed in the Apostles' Creed are foundational. This Lent we will begin a series from Pastor Adam Hamilton on the Apostles Creed. It will be the teaching series at Transformation Worship and I will be offering a discipleship class on Wednesday nights beginning February 21st. This is one of the Church's early statements that articulates the essentials of what it means to be a follower of Jesus. In this series we will consider those beliefs and begin holy conversation around what Christians believe, why they believe it, and why it matters. Join us for this powerful Lenten Series as we dive deeper into our theology on Wednesday's evenings and Sunday mornings!

Mission of the Month

Be a Blessing to Someone – Love INC

People in need will often approach a church for assistance. Unfortunately, many churches are not equipped to meet the variety of needs that are presented. That's not a failure of the churches - at their core, they are faith organizations, not relief agencies. But, the Christian imperative is to help. Love INC works like this: when someone approaches a member church for assistance, they are referred to Love INC. Love INC then conducts an interview to fully determine the need, and which church is best able to assist. Love In The Name of Christ (Love INC) pools the strengths of area churches to reach out to those in need - our church is one of 28 partners.

Let's Fill the Barn This Year

Farm animals are a common sight in lowa, and it seemed appropriate to fill a barnyard to support Heifer International. Donate as you wish throughout the year and we'll keep adding animals like cows, sheep, goats, donkeys, pigs, ducks, geese, chickens, rabbits, and beehives to the barn in the window of the church office. It'll be fun to see how much livestock we can collect by December of 2018. And remember, Heifer animals are the gift that keeps on giving, so don't be surprised if baby animals appear in the barn every so often.

So far we have a lonely sheep and a goat in the big red barn. They could use some friends to keep them company.

February Mission Focus Love INC Wee Care

Wee Care is First UMC's way of showing that we care about the little ones in our community. We've supported and hosted this ministry since July of 2011, and it is one of the most heavily used gap ministries with Love In the Name of Christ.

How does Wee Care work?

It begins with a call to the Love INC Clearinghouse. The Clearinghouse volunteer assesses the need and sets up an appointment for the parent to come to our church to pick up the items. Most of the families who are helped by our Wee Care ministry are single parent households who are struggling to get by on their small income and keep up with their baby's needs. There is a cap on how many appointments they can have in a given year, and once the child reaches 24 months of age they are no longer eligible for Wee Care assistance.

The Love INC Clearinghouse has an easy-to-use online system for providing a list of requested baby items and for getting appointment and contact information to the Wee Care volunteers from First UMC. On Tuesday, the weekly volunteer retrieves the list of needs and

packs up the items from the special storage area for our Wee Care items at the church. The appointments are set from noon until 2:00 on Tuesday afternoons, and the baby items are picked up at the Welcome Center. The Wee Care volunteer is welcome to offer a word of support or encouragement to the parent, and to pray for the wee ones. A struggling parent can always use a kind word.



So, how can you help?

Pick up a shopping list at the display in the Gathering Place. Baby supplies for our Love INC Wee Care ministry are always appreciated. Baby wash, baby lotion, baby wipes, diapers in all sizes, burp cloths, receiving blankets, baby washcloths, bottles (4 and 8 oz) and sippy cups can always be used. Seasonal clothing is also helpful to have on hand, and parents are grateful for the cute new clothes or warm jackets. Of course, if you see a good deal on end-of-season baby clothes feel free to bring them in. We have a place to store them until the appropriate season. We cannot accept baby powder or any baby foods (or formula or pedialyte).

You may bring baby supplies to the church anytime, but this month the best place to leave them is in the basket by the display in the Gathering Place. If you are not a shopper, you can make a monetary donation and we will purchase the supplies most needed. Checks can be made to FUMC, with "Wee Care" on the memo line. Thank you for your ongoing support of our WeeCare ministry to support mothers with small children who could use a little help.

Blankets+ Update (January Mission)

As of print time, we had collected enough funds to provide 105 warm blankets to those in crisis. These blankets are used for warmth, shelter, and comfort. In 2016 Church World Service sent 3,064 blankets to people in need in the US and beyond. Between July and October of 2017, over 2,750 blankets had been distributed.

The CWS Blankets program is one of the many ways CWS shares in a hope-filled tomorrow. Your support has enabled CWS to distribute blankets to support newly arrived refugees, victims of floods or fires, homeless shelter guests and migrant workers. Your support truly makes a difference in the lives of children and families the world over. Thank you for your generosity to our January mission focus.

Another Great Year of Partnership With Banyam Seminary

2017 represented another step forward in our partnership with Banyam Theological Seminary in Nigeria. We moved from being simply project-focused to being relationship-focused as we traded pastors for two weeks last June. We were fortunate to be able to have BTS Provost Rev. Dr. John Pena and his wife, Titi here in Cedar Falls for two weeks. Many of you hosted Dr. Pena and Titi in your homes and now you have a friend - someone you know by name - in Africa, and that's pretty cool!

We also continued to support the mission and ministry of BTS by sending nearly \$9,000. Early in January, we received this note from Freedom Oggah, BTS Treasurer, explaining how those funds were to be used:

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, we pray for God to protect and guide us in this new year 2018.

Below is the breakdown and how the \$8,923.04 will be used.

1.\$2,031.06 For two semester school fees of four students,they are Polina, Titus, Blessing and Anthony

2.\$2,060.42 Stipend for clinic staff for one year

3.\$2,000 for drug in clinic

4.\$2,831.02 for computer lab to purchase four new laptop Thanks,Freedom Oggah, BTS Treasurer

Freedom and his wife Regina suffered an unexpected miscarrage and lost their first child. Regina is expected to recover. We first met Freedom and Regina on our first trip to BTS in 2012 - they weren't married yet! - and they've been a part of all of our BTS experiences.
