However, I have always found myself plagued with New Year's resolutions. I'm sure many of you have as well. In fact, University of Scranton psychologist Dr. John Norcross blogged in a recent study that 40% of us make New Year's resolutions. I always vow to read my bible more, or lose 5 pounds, or take on another way to serve. I'm sure you have many of your own that you have made over the years. However, the study also showed that less than half of the people that make New Year's resolutions keep them after six months.

This year, I want to encourage you to keep it simple. Instead of taking on a new workout routine, vowing to quit smoking, or save more money, I want to suggest something a bit different. Not that these popular new year's resolutions are bad, but they are not fully inclusive of the good news of the bible.

Here is my challenge to all of us that comes from John Wesley's (Founder of the Methodist Movement) covenant service. Commit yourselves to Christ as his servants. Give yourselves to him, that you may belong to him. Christ has many services to be done. Some are more easy and honorable, others are more difficult and disgraceful. Some are suitable to our inclinations and interests, others are contrary to both. In some we may please Christ and please ourselves. But then there are other works where we cannot please Christ except by denying ourselves. It is necessary, therefore, that we consider what it means to be a servant of Christ.

Let us therefore go to Christ, and pray: Let me be your servant, under your command. I will no longer be my own. I will give up myself to your will in all things.

Let us ring in this New Year vowing to be servants under the authority of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In the midst of that covenant, I promise your weight loss, kicking of bad habits, saving more money, and every other resolution you can make will be covered and then some. Under the power and guidance of the Holy Spirit, you will not become a statistic after six months.



If you could only hold onto one Greek word from the New Testament it should be this: Agape

In other words, love is not something we feel, rather, love is something we do. It is an action verb. This leaves us with the conclusion that love is a choice. It is time to leave love behind as a feeling, and step forward into a love that "does".


Clearinghouse Reception Volunteer

- \$2,500 can provide 250 blankets to an agency serving homeless individuals and families in the U.S.



Grant Support!


