

Our culture is more polarized than ever before, and our church community reflects this as well. We all are able to consult the same scriptures as we seek faithful guidance for questions of morality, and yet we read those scriptures differently, and reach opposing conclusions. How are we to move forward as a cohesive Christian community in these divided times?

The first step, it seems, is to (re)learn how to hold civil discussions on sensitive topics, and we will be doing that in our Crucial Conversations worship series beginning January 13. Each week we'll dig into an issue that ignites deep passions and opposing viewpoints. Our pastors will explore the Biblical basis for each side of the issue, we'll look into the United Methodist Social Principles, and our pastors will also shed a little insight into their own opinions.

#### Pairs of Chairs

The pastors will not do all of the talking in this series, your active participation is welcome. During the Sunday School hour for these six weeks, you will have the opportunity to discuss these issues with someone you may or may not know, and with whom you may or may not agree. We'll fill Fellowship Hall with pairs of chairs and in ten-minute segments, you will be invited to sit and discuss the issue of the day – listening and learning each other's perspectives. All are welcome in the discussion sessions and there are only two rules: 1) seek to understand, rather than convince, and 2) close in prayer together.

#### Where is this leading?

As you may know, The United Methodist Church has been wrestling with our official positions and policies regarding sexuality identity for decades. The conflict has become a dominant issue in our denomination's politics, and in the interest of moving beyond this state of contention, a special General Conference of the global United Methodist Church will take place February 23-26 in St. Louis, Missouri. There are proposals on the table which may have deep and lasting impact on the official position of our denomination and how we operate our church. We encourage everyone to be as informed as possible.



**February 17 - 26**, during the week of the special General Conference, our own First UMC chapel will be open for you to come and pray for the future of our church.

**Sunday, February 24** will be set aside as a day of prayer at all three of our worship services. At the same time that we are gathering here, in Cedar Falls, the General Conference delegates will be meeting in St. Louis, and we will support them with our prayers that their discussions be led by reason, wisdom, and first, love.

#### Did you know?

That our Church has an Endowment Committee that oversees, manages and approves distributions from funds it has received in the form of bequests from the estates of deceased members and other sources of funds, including gifts it has received from members who are currently living.

The Endowment Committee was formed in 1999 through action approved by the Charge Conference. The Committee was created and exists solely for charitable purposes with its primary objectives being the establishment, promotion and development of religious charitable and educational activities of The Church.

The Endowment Committee has become very active over the past several years and meets several times a year to monitor the investment activity, to determine annual distribution amounts, receive requests for distributions of the funds and to vote on these distribution requests.



The Committee is well aware of the need to make appropriate decisions on the distribution amounts and to balance its desire to continue to increase the value of the funds under its management authority. Our goal is to grow the investments in order to increase the annual distribution amounts we approve each year. We realize that in order to keep up with inflation and the ever-increasing financial needs of a vibrant church we need to increase the amount of the funds under our management.

Gifts to our Endowment Committee are gifts that keep on giving for many years into the future and help to secure our Church's financial security.

You will be hearing more from the Endowment Committee in the upcoming year(s) as we communicate the importance of the funds we manage and how they benefit the Church in many ways.

First UMC Endowment Funds

#### Budget-Driven Changes at Iowa UMC Conference

In industrial terms, we would say "leaner and meaner", but this is a church, so we don't say it quite that way. Our Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church has been looking at ways to reduce the conference budget and to keep more money (and responsibility) at the local church level. A target has been set to reduce the conference budget by \$1 million for the coming year. As you might expect, that may mean drastic changes in the funding and operations of some lowa UMC institutions. Here are expected proposals to meet that goal:

- 1. Move from eight District Offices with eight District Administrative Assistants to four bi-District Offices with four District Administrative Assistants. Estimated reduction: \$319,000 for 2020.
- 2. Reconfigure the deployment of Associates for Congregational Excellence from four fulltime positions to two full-time positions to focus on revitalization, with two 1/4 Associates to resource new and existing immigrant Communities of Faith. recommend implementation July 1, 2019. Estimated reduction: \$60,000 for 2019 and \$120,000 in 2020.
- 3. Replace Assistant to the Bishop with Secretary to the Cabinet and realign duties among this position and District Administrative Assistants. Estimated expense reduction: \$45,300 in 2020.

- 4. Combine the Address Services/Journal Editor position with the Director of Ministerial Services. Estimated expense reduction: \$51,240 in 2020.
- 5. Reduce the apportioned funding to the Board of Higher Education and Campus ministry from \$544,933 to \$44,933. This is a dramatic reduction to the Iowa Wesley Foundations including the one

here at UNI - Threehouse. Estimated expense reduction: \$500,000 in 2020.

- 6. Reduce the apportioned funding of Community and Institutional Ministry grants by \$150,000. Estimated expense reduction: \$150,000 in 2020.
- 7. End our apportioned funding of the Iowa Religious Media Service. Estimated expense reduction: \$78,000 in 2020.
- 8. Reduce the apportioned funding to the Board of Camping and Retreat Ministry from \$687,887 to \$617,887. Estimated expense reduction: \$70,000 in 2020.

These proposals from the Iowa Conference Budget Team were made public in a letter dated November 30, 2018. If you would like to see the full text of this letter, see Chris in the First UMC media office.

The Iowa Conference Budget Team has scheduled three information and listening sessions where all interested parties are invited to hear the proposed changes and share in discussion. The closest of these sessions is January 13, in North Liberty, from 2:45 - 4:15 pm. If you are interested in attending this Iowa Conference budget discussion, please inform our Finance Manager, Debbie Dance.

#### Preach It. **Brothers and Sisters**

The United Methodist Church is very clear in its doctrine that ministry is a partnership between ordained clergy and us, the laity. We all have skills and gifts that are useful in service to the cause of Christ. Among the laity, some of us can serve in ministries of music, the Congregational Care Team, and any of our First UMC missions.

We even have a crew of lay-speakers who help other churches with worship leadership. This group, known as the Circuit Riders, is currently supplying worship leadership to the United Methodists of Frederika and New Hope Parrish (Dumont & Aredale). On any given Sunday, at least two members of CF First UMC are on the road, leading prayers and delivering sermons in these churches.


Serving in this way is an exciting opportunity for us to meet other lowa United Methodists and to assist them in maintaining their Sunday services in the absence of a regular pastor.

Many, but not all, of our Circuit Riders are graduates of the School For Lay Ministry. All have a heart for worship and for sharing stories of faith that others may find useful in their lives.

Chris Congdon in our First UMC media office says this, "A goal of most churches is to equip and encourage people in their own lives of ministry. I love that our church actually provides a pathway for those whose gifts are in the spoken ministries of telling the stories of the Gospel."


We can always use a few more Circuit Riders. If this ministry sounds interesting to you, talk to Chris Congdon about exploring further.

- •A father struggling for sobriety in Little Rock, Arkansas
- An Oklahoma woman recently released from incarceration looking for work

Over and over Jesus served people like this, embracing them. And that's what we want to model as the people of The United Methodist Church. To continue the ministry of Jesus we established Human Relations Day as a Special Sunday that calls all of our churches to participate in helping all God's children to realize their potential. Special offering envelopes will be in the January 15 bulletins.

#### January Mission Focus Church World Service Blankets +

January is great month to appreciate a warm blanket. Contributions to CWS Blankets and CWS Tools mean Church World Service will be ready to help families around the world recover from disasters and displacement. We are planning to send some of our Christmas offering to BTS. They have current needs for replenished medical supplies and medicines at the Medical Clinic totally about \$2000. At the computer lab, they could really use 6-8 more used laptops for the students to share as they improve their writing, research and communication skills.

They are hoping to build a new administrative building for more faculty offices in 2019. They even asked if FUMC Cedar Falls would be interested in sending a work crew to help construct the walls of the new admin building next summer. If you are interested in some type of work trip to Nigeria, talk to Mark Fransdal or Chris Congdon. It sounds like some hard work, but we know it can be immensely rewarding work. We have asked for more information about this work trip and what it would entail. More later.....
