

Our Pastor's Response to Traditional Plan

Beginning January 1, 2020, the Traditional Plan, as adopted by the global United Methodist Church, will be in effect. Your pastors believe these policies to be harmful and unjust, and this is their response:

We have always left room for conversation in the midst of disagreement. We have modeled that and have invited you to participate in crucial conversations over the past year. These new policies of the United Methodist Church, if enforced, would leave little room for open dialogue.

The Traditional Plan policies are particularly concerning to your pastors as they discriminate against LGBTQ+ persons becoming pastoral leaders, and would punish clergy who provide pastoral care in the form of celebrating all marriages. The new policies now elevate a perceived sexual sin above any other sin in our Book of Discipline, and further, for clergy who officiate a wedding of same-sex, consenting and loving adults, the automatic result is a one year suspension and the second time, the clergy's credentials are removed. While the Book of Discipline says that all are created with sacred worth, not all are allowed to participate fully in the sacred ministry of the church.

What do the new global policies mean for us at Cedar Falls First UMC? Our vision is simply: Love First. Let's gather, grow, go...together. Nothing about the way we do ministry here at First UMC is changing. We are a church that extends radical hospitality to everyone. When we say "all are welcome here", we mean ALL. We will continue to stay on-mission by making new disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the World.

The two of us will be leading a prayer service on Sunday, January 5th at 10am in our sanctuary. It will be a time of expressing our lament, and naming our resistance to harm. Please consider joining us for this prayer service.



Three Ten Connect

Here's an easy way to welcome our guests in Sunday worship: 3 ● 10 ● Connect.

It's simple: in the **first three minutes** after a worship service has ended, look around in a **tenfoot radius** and see if there's someone you don't know. If so, stick out your hand and say "hi". Make a little conversation. Ask them if they have any questions about our church, and if so, volunteer to introduce them to a pastor, a staff person, or someone you know to have the answer. Then, be sure to say that you, personally, are glad that they are here, and that you hope to see them again. It's that easy. **3 • 10 • Connect.**

First UMC Live Online

The whole world - including you - can watch our Sunday sermons live, online at our First UMC facebook page. The video stream for Transformation worship starts around 8:55, and the Traditional worship stream starts around 10:25. Please, if you can't make it in-person, consider watching on Facebook!

Also, be aware that this means there are live cameras in our worship spaces. Our cameras are usually positioned to show only the morning's speaker, but it is possible that the congregation may also appear in the livestream. If, for any reason you wish to ensure that you do not appear on-camera, please ask our camera operator for a safe place to sit.

First UMC Recycles - a Win - Win - Win

For years, our church office has collected waste paper for recycling, but that has been limited to the office, only. Now, we're rolling that option out to the rest of the building. You'll find small, blue recycling bins in the foyer outside of the sanctuary, and near the exit

to Fellowship Hall. Use these for the pieces of your church bulletin that you do not wish to take home. Also, in the Gathering Place, you will find a threebin recycling station for waste paper, aluminum beverage cans, and plastic beverage bottles.

This recycling effort is a small piece of good stewardship to return these waste resources to the production stream, rather than simply throwing them into the landfill. And, it's not just First UMC who benefits from our recycling. Our waste paper is collected by River Hills School, which uses it



as a fundraiser, and our beverage containers will be collected by our Troop 44 Boy Scouts who are already hosting can/bottle drives here once a month. So, First UMC recycling is a win for all three organizations, as well as this beautiful planet we call home. Thanks to the HOME Team and Trustees for implementing this new program.

Now Hear This

Here's some help for those who find it difficult to hear in the sanctuary. We're equipped with a set of listeningassistance devices. They are little radios that pick up the pastor's microphones and amplify the signal for you. The radios plug into a provided earpiece, or you may bring your own headphones (standard mini-plug). Also, those with telephone-enabled hearing aids may request a wire "necklace" that transmits the signal directly into the hearing aid no headphones necessary! If you'd like to try one of these devices, ask an usher and they will get one for you and show you how to use it.

A Thank You from In-Mission Together

2 Corinthians 9:7 King James Version (KJV) 7 "Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver."

During my childhood this is the bible verse my pastor recited every Sunday before the offering was taken. I hadn't thought about it in years until I became a part of the In-Missions Together committee, now I'm in awe of the "cheerful" givers at Cedar Falls FUMC.

Generous donations to the Angel Tree provided 39 children with gifts and every family a gift card this Christmas season. The November Mission Tree provided over 500 bus rides for low income men and women in local shelters, more than 90 Bibles for the Women at the Well* and lots and lots of diapers and supplies for families using Wee Care. Our quilters donated 17 quilts to give to foster children in the Cedar Valley and many of you walked and packaged food to help the hungry. The list goes on and on.

You will see some changes in our First UMC missions this year. First of all, our name has changed from Rainbow Task Force to In Mission Together. The United Methodist Church has challenged us to find more missions that go beyond simply donating money, and to invest our members' time and efforts, providing a physical presence to assist in programs that help spread the word of God and make disciples of Jesus Christ.

There are some new faces on our missions committee and Lisa who has been the heart of missions at First UMC has stepped down as chair to allow more time for her duties at Washington Chapel. In Missions Together is looking forward to supporting our congregation's missions on local, conference, national, and international levels, through giving, sharing and partnering, to fulfill Matthew 25 and Matthew 28.

Putting Love Into Action

Many years ago, Joanne, the young mother of an infant child, was devastated by the unexpected death of her husband. In the months that followed, she tried several ways of dealing with her grief and pain, but found very little help. As a result of her own experience, a seed was planted in her heart – a desire to be there for others who faced similar circumstances.

A few years later, Joanne saw a notice in her church bulletin inviting people to serve as Stephen Ministers. She responded. In her decade of service as a Stephen Minister, Joanne has had the opportunity to care for people with a variety of needs, including a recent care receiver who was a young widow. Joanne said, "It was very satisfying to be able to give her the kind of help I didn't have."

Currently we have several members of our congregation who are serving as Stephen Ministers and others who are now taking the training to become the next group commissioned. After being trained, this group will be assigned to meet weekly with a person of the same gender and help the person walk through the stress of bereavement, terminal illness, single parenting, long-term illness, job loss, etc.

We ask you to pray for our Stephen Ministry program and those who serve. If you are going through a stressful time yourself, please do not hesitate to call the church office and you will be directed in confidence to someone who can help.

Governmental regulations prohibit health care facilities (this includes hospitals, assisted living and nursing homes) from sharing information about their patients and residents, so if you want your church family to know you need our love and prayers, please call the church office.
