## **Church World Service Blankets**

January is great month to appreciate a warm blanket.

Contributions to CWS Blankets and CWS Tools mean

Church World Service will be ready to help families around
the world recover from disasters and displacement. What's
more, they'll be there to help people gain the resources
and develop the skills necessary to build - or rebuild sustainable lives and communities.

Imagine the possibilities:

- •\$250 can provide warm blankets for five families left homeless by a tornado.
- •\$450 can provide refugees resettling far from their homelands the gardening tools and materials to build six small raised beds for vegetables.
- •\$750 can provide sewing machines and training for three women, empowering them to earn an income and feed their families.
- •\$1,100 can provide 10 displaced families with emergency food packages that will feed a family of five for one month.
- •\$2,500 can provide 250 blankets to an agency serving homeless individuals and families in the U.S.

We have three rooms reserved in the dorm at Midwest Mission Distribution Center the first week of May, 2023. Each dorm room houses two people – on bottom bunks. If you are looking for a way to serve in a comfortable and not-too-far-away place, this is a great place to do it! It's very affordable at



\$136 per person (plus cost for meals and gas to get there). They will need a down payment of \$68 from each participant by March 7. Ask Gary and Karen Nelson about their experience last May. ## Quilter's and Stitchers Progress in 2022!

The Quilters and Stitchers at FUMC have made and distributed approximately 230 quilts in 2022! These include:


- 45+ Cover With Love Quilts for Mid-West Mission
- 80 Youth Quilts to Lincoln School Christmas Baskets. Black Hawk County Adoption Day, Foster Kid Quilts through Kaden's Kloset, and Foster 18 Quilts for those graduating out of foster care
- 70 Comfort Quilts to Church members, Iowa Corrections Memorial Quilts, Black Hawk Veterans, and Memory Quilts.
- 11 Habitat Quilts (for those moving into new Habitat Homes)
- 24+ Quilts Sold for Rummage Sale and Mission Ingathering, plus quilts sold to individuals and many miscellaneous small quilts and quilted items sold for Ingathering and Rummage Sale with sales of about \$2000 donated to these Missions.

In addition to the Quilts, the Quilters and Stitchers made and filled 430 School Bags, 104 Hygiene Kits, 12 Layette Kits plus over 20 baby kimonos for Mission Ingathering.

Another project started in 2019 are Days for Girls Menstrual Kits. This year 825 liners, 300 shields, and 207 bags were made.

The Quilters and Stitchers would like to thank everyone who has contributed fabric, made monetary donations and purchased quilts. This keeps the group going as they must buy supplies, including batting and backing materials. Keep the donations coming!

We welcome anyone to drop in on Tuesday mornings from 9 to noon to visit and see what we are doing!
