It is like a dream come true! Janet and I will be traveling to Nigeria from June 14 through June 28 as part of a "Pulpit Exchange" with Banyan Theological Seminary. John and Titi Pena will be coming to Cedar Falls from B.T.S. where he serves as the Provost. Our mission for both couples will be to strengthen our relationship with B.T.S. and Cedar Falls First as we work together in serving Christ through the church. This trip fulfills our TEAM Christ Vision of being Builders of the Kingdom by expanding our ministry beyond our church!

John and Titi will be living in our parsonage. John will be preaching at the Traditional Sunday Services on July 18 and 20. Coved Oswald will be staying with them to host and assist them while they are here in Cedar Falls. Coved is a UNI College student who has joined our church, and you may have noticed him playing in our Bell Choir and helping with the children and youth programs. Mark Fransdal and Chris Congdon will also be helping host the Penas because they have come to know each other from their trips to Nigeria.

We are hoping that our congregation members will invite Penas to join them for supper or coffees. We want to host them as warmly as they have hosted our mission teams when we traveled to Nigeria. Ideally it would be great if a Sunday School Class, UMW Circle or Church friends invite them for a backyard barbeque or neighborhood picnic. Also there are some great opportunities to show them the best of Cedar Falls in making sure they attend Sturgis Falls and the Band Concerts.

We are really looking forward to this trip. I will be teaching students at B.T.S. and leading a three day Pastor's Retreat while we are there. Janet will be working with at the Medical Clinic our church built on the campus, plus working with the Nigerian Medical Committee in making plans for the future. Both of us will be working at helping build on the 27 years of the Iowa Nigeria Partnership. Our focus will be in establishing a new 5 year plan that will focus on the areas of Education, Medical, and Wells.

Early in my ministry I felt a call to do mission work of this nature. I dreamed of the adventure of going to faraway places to make a difference in the name of Christ. Instead, I lived out my dream by taking youth groups and adults on mission trips to Henderson Settlement and Red Bird in Kentucky, Blackfeet Indian Reservation in Montana, and to the inner cities of Des Moines, Chicago, Kansas City and St. Louis. They were all adventures that have left wonderful memories and the reward of making a difference in people's lives.

Janet also shared a similar dream of using her nursing skills in remote clinics somewhere in our world. Jesus is always knocking on the door of her heart, and she has found her calling in helping kids in school or as a county health nurse. Going to Nigeria is also fulfilling a dream for Janet.

This will be the first time there has been an exchange of Pastors between Iowa and Nigeria, so we invite you to be in prayer for the Penas and us as we seek to strengthen the bond between our conferences. It will be a dream come true for us to travel to Nigeria. We ask for your prayers for a safe and meaningful trip. We know there will be many "God moments" on our trip. We hope to come home with many stories to share about the great things you have done in the name of Christ.


We all want to be different, but we don't want to change. We think we know what we're supposed to do, but we're not quite sure who we're supposed to be on the other side of transformation.



Our initial connection with Banyam Theological Seminary in Nigeria came when our church was challenged to help them achieve an internet connection and computer access for students on-campus. We were visited by John Pena and Davidson Adams from Nigeria as we raised funds for that effort.

In 2012, Mark Fransdal and Chris Congdon accepted an invitation to go to the seminary to see the finished, functioning, computer lab and to meet some staff and students. From this visit, relationships and friendship were formed that continue today.

From that first visit came the dream of a medical clinic on the seminary grounds, and with the help of a couple of partner churches in NE Iowa, we were able to fund the construction of that clinic. A year later, in 2015, the walls were up and ready for paint. Mark and Chris, along with Dave Neill and Pastor Steve and Janet went to see the progress and to do the painting work. That visit led to more friendships on the BTS campus as we worked and lived side by side with the students, faculty and staff.



The clinic has been functioning and we have raised funds for some simple laboratory tests and diagnostic supplies. Steve and Janet Williams will be taking those medical supplies with them on their trip to Banyam Theological Seminary in mid-June.

During the month of June your donations to Banyam Theological Seminary will be used to help provide scholarships for students. The United Methodist Church in Nigeria is growing at an astronomical rate, and BTS is the only United Methodist Seminary in the country. The cost for a year of seminary is only \$400, which may not seem much to us but can be a real hardship for the seminary students.

You will have an opportunity to meet the provost of BTS, John Pena, while John and his wife, Titi, are here in Cedar Falls this month. Please welcome them warmly and feel free to ask questions about the seminary and the clinic. They are pleased to be in partnership with us and appreciative of our support.

Learn to Climb Upward

A father tells about his five year old son, Aaron, wanting to learn to climb a big tree in their back yard. He said, "When I lifted Aaron onto the tree's lowest branch, he panicked for fear of falling. I tried to coach him along, telling him to first kneel on the branch, then slowly stand up and climb to the center of the tree. But Aaron was so focused on his fear of falling that he couldn't move. I finally shouted, 'Aaron!' Once I had his attention, I told him to quit thinking about falling and think about climbing! Aaron thought about that for awhile and then started to climb to the center of the tree. His fear was gone, and he was able to do what he wanted."

The phrase, "think about climbing" is a good one to hold onto. Most of us periodically are faced with change of some kind or an impossible looking project, and find ourselves being fearful. If we give in to the fear, we are crippled with respect



to moving ahead/upward. But, if we think about climbing - not falling, failing, or being overcome - we can move upward to what we want.

Sometimes illness, losing a job, or loved one, difficulty/tragedy in a loved one's life, various adverse circumstances and so many other things, can cause us to focus more on "falling" then on "climbing upward." Like Aaron was encouraged to change his focus by his father, we can often benefit by another person encouraging us to climb upward. Stephen Ministers are trained to do just that. They don't condemn; they aren't shocked by any circumstance, responses, or emotions. They just want to be channels through which the love and healing power of God can flow to help people climb upward out of difficulty.
