

Ecclesia: Authentic Christian Community

Imagine you find yourself stranded on a deserted island with nothing but a copy of the bible. You have no experience with Christianity whatsoever, and all you know about the Church will come from reading of the bible. How would you imagine a church to function? Seriously. Close your eyes for two minutes and picture "Church" as you would know it. Now think about your own experience with church. Are they even close? Can you live with that?

After the resurrection of Jesus, he appeared to his disciples on several occasions. He told them to go to Jerusalem and wait to begin their mission until power came from on-high. It was not until the disciples received the Holy Spirit that they were fully equipped to go out and make disciples for the transformation of the world. We call this event Pentecost. It was the birth of the New Testament church. During the weeks after Pentecost, most mainline churches focuses on their mission and vision.

In our "Love First" teaching series, we have been spending a lot of time doing just that. We want to be clear about why our church exists. It is easy for churches to become inward focused and stray from what the early church was. When we read the bible, we find the description of the early church in Acts 2:42-47. It reads like this.

"42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

When we think of a church, we often think of a building or a location. In the early church, the Greek word for that was ecclesia, which meant assembly or gathering. The church was not centered on a building, or a pastor, but rather, it was entirely centered on the genuineness of the gathered community. It was a place where bread was broken, sound teaching was experienced, and there was no one among them in need. This is the vision for the Church. A Church that above everything, loves first.

Based upon a biblical vision of what church is to be, has that been your experience? If the answer is no, I ask again, can you live with that? And third, I would challenge us to consider ways we can give of ourselves to make that Kingdom vision a greater reality in the Cedar Valley. Let's be an Acts 2 church...one that above all...loves first.

From the Democratic Republic of Congo where local United Methodist church members mentor former child soldiers, to a peace march organized by United Methodists in Iowa, to developing nonviolent strategies that address the cold war in the Korean Peninsula, Peace with Justice is a faithful and biblical expression of shalom. It calls the church to strengthen our capacity to advocate publicly in communities and nations throughout the world by saying, "Here I am. Send me."

Funds have been used to:

- *Create a United Methodist peace ministry uniting Arizona border communities
- *Equip Liberian United Methodists to implement the denomination's Social Principles and address social-justice issues contextually.
- *Provide resources for Pennsylvania students to educate their community about sex-trafficking at home and abroad.

Connectional giving through offerings like Peace with Justice Sunday provides an opportunity for us to share the costs of worldwide ministry with other United Methodists.

You Might Be On Camera

Here's some news that's exciting to share, and maybe a concern for some. We are now livestreaming the sermon/teaching portion of our Sunday worship services on Facebook. We're thrilled to be able to share our sermons with the whole world in real-time. If you can't make it to church on Sunday, the Transformation message goes live about 9:00, and the Traditional message goes live at about 10:25 – please tune in.

Sharing our message with the whole world is important, and so is your personal security. The ability to stream video to the internet means that there are live cameras in our worship spaces. For some people, this might be a concern. There are



all kinds of reasons that any particular person might not want the world to know where they are at that moment on a Sunday morning. The vast majority of the time, the pastor is the only person visible in the livestream, but sometimes portions of the crowd are visible, too. If you have any questions about where to sit in our worship spaces so that you will not be visible to the cameras, please talk to Chris in the media office.

The last Sunday in June is our local Sturgis Falls celebration. We will be having one worship service only on that Sunday, 10:00 a.m. in the sanctuary.

Three Ten Connect

Here's an easy way to welcome our guests in Sunday worship called **3 • 10 • Connect**.

It's simple: in the first three minutes after a worship service has ended, look around in a ten-foot radius and see if there's someone you don't know. If so, stick out your hand and say "hi". Make a little conversation. Ask them if they have any questions about our church, and if so, volunteer to introduce them to a pastor, a staff person, or someone you know to have the answer. Then, be sure to say that you, personally, are glad that they are here, and that you hope to see them again. It's that easy. 3 • 10 • Connect.

There are opportunities in both Transformation Worship and in Traditional Worship to lead the time of welcome and announcements, read scripture, lead prayers, make music, serve communion, present the children's message, and help on the tech team. Why Sign In?

In every Sunday worship experience, you are invited to sign-in on the attendance pad. It is more important than you may realize.

First, it lets us know that you were here. We DO track this in the church office. If you don't signin, you were not here.

In our weekly church staff meetings, we review reports of new visitors who have signedin. We look to see who else may have been sitting near them and greeted them. This information helps us to refine our hospitality and outreach efforts.

When visitors in our worship services see our members signing-in, they are more likely to do so, as well, and that provides our pastors with information to follow up with them later in the week.

If you see a visitor sitting nearby (or perhaps a longtime member whose name you don't remember) the sign-in pad gives you a place to look so that you may greet that person by name.

Finally, we also look at reports of regular attenders who are uncharacteristically absent. Many times we know why this is, but sometimes an absence is unexplained, and may trigger a call from a pastor or parish visitor.

We are a family of faith. Knowing our people is the core of our operation as a church community. By signing-in every Sunday, you help us to have good information to work with, so thanks for doing so!

Retiring our Mortgage

Once again a very generous family in our church has offered to cover our mortgage interest from Mother's Day, May 12th – Fathers' Day, June 16th. That means every additional dollar we pay toward our mortgage during this time period will go directly to reducing

our principle mortgage amount. This is another great opportunity to take a big bite out of our outstanding debt.

Let's not forget the amazing progress we have already made on this loan. The total investment for our renovation / construction project was nearly \$4.5 million dollars. At the completion of the project just six years ago, we were left with a loan of \$1.4 million dollars. In just those six years we have reduced that debt to \$260,640! We are so close to paying this off, and just think of how nice it will be to be out from under this debt!



June mission focus- UMCOR Hygiene Kits

We can't plan for disasters – they simply happen, often without warning. Floods and tornados have hit lowa communities and our neighboring states hard this year. For those who have been driven from their homes, it becomes difficult to perform even the most basic bits of personal care. The United Methodist Committee of Relief (UMCOR) is quick to respond with practical items for our neighbors and friends but, they can't do it without help. You can help by providing supplies for UMCOR hygiene kits. These are distributed at shelters for those who have been displaced by a disaster in the USA.



1 hand towel (15x25 to 17x27 inches) - new/unwashed

1 washcloth - new and unwashed

1 comb - sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth

1 toenail or fingernail clipper

1 bath-size bar of soap in wrapper (no Ivory or Jergens) 1 adult toothbrush in the original sealed wrapper 10 adhesive bandages (3/4 x 3 inches)

Bring enough for a kit, or simply find a good deal on one or more of the items and donate a bunch of them. We can also use one gallon size re-sealable bags. Bring the items to the display in the Gathering Place.







Bibles for Our Sisters in Mitchellville

A very tangible way we can help our sisters behind the razor wire is to provide Bibles for them. We have an opportunity to order new Bibles to be sent to the women's prison directly from Cokesbury. They are given to the ladies in Bible Studies and to keep for their own use. We have send dozens of Bibles in past years and they are so appreciated. The Common English Bible for is an easy to read Bible. This is the Bible that Lisa in the church office has been using, and it's sturdy and feels nice and is easy to use. These Bibles normally sell for over \$20, but Cokesbury has made special arrangements for friends of the Women at the Well UMC to order them for only \$10. Love INC works like this: when someone approaches a member church for assistance, they are referred to Love INC. Love INC then conducts an interview to fully determine the need, and which church is best able to assist. Love In The Name of Christ (Love INC) pools the strengths of area churches and agencies to reach out to those in need - our church is one of 29.

What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a system through which members of First United Methodist Church are trained and organized to help provide Christian care giving to members of our congregation and community. This will multiply the amount of caring ministry our church can provide by giving us a whole team of skilled caregivers who are equipped to bring Christ's healing love to people who are grieving, in crisis, or experiencing other stresses in life.

Stephen Ministers

- Are lay Christians selected, trained, and supervised by Stephen Leaders to provide effective Christian care.
- Make a commitment which includes 50 hours of training, ongoing supervisory meetings, and an average of one, one-hour visits per month with the person receiving care.
- Are named after St. Stephen, one of the first deacons in the early Christian church, commissioned by the apostles to care for the needs of the people in the Christian community.
- Recognize this as a confidential ministry in which continuous effort is expended to maintain the body of trust between the person receiving care and the caregiver.
