I write this as I prepare to attend the special session of the Iowa Annual Conference. The only action is to receive the churches that are resolved to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. It's not easy to gather my thoughts in such a time.

Recently, I heard an address by UM Bishop Thomas J. Bickerton (It can be found here: https://youtu.be/zyQ\_Mojdg0 ). I was captured by this quote, "relationship is not dependent upon agreement, but it is dependent upon the want to inside."

Here at First UMC we have a vision, "a want to inside," Love first. Adopting such a "want to" has affected the way we are in relationship together. We may not agree on everything, but we want to stay in relationship. It's an approach that says we are stronger with you and we are the body of Christ more fully with you, than without you. The question is, do you want to?

• Nothing has changed at First UMC—our mission and vision remain the same since January of 2019.

• We continue to lead prayerfully and use Christian discernment to stay connected. Any changes will involve a congregational vote.

• As your pastors we will continue to listen and offer counsel to all members of our congregation.

• Future forums will be offered to keep the congregation informed.

We need each other now more than ever if we are to reclaim our passion for the vision to Love first.
