

Janet and I are looking forward to our trip to the Holy Land this month. For me a trip to the Holy Land is like a conversion experience. The journey renews and revitalizes my faith. Our trip will take us from Jesus' birthplace in Bethlehem to his years in Nazareth . . . from his travels throughout the land of Israel to his walk between Gethsemane and the cross on Golgotha . . . from the rocky tomb to the shores of Galilee. This is our opportunity to walk in Jesus' sandals to see with his eyes, and feel with his heart. One of our most meaningful days for me is to walk the Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem. The Via Dolorosa or the Way of Sorrow is the traditional route that Jesus took between his condemnation by Pilate through the city streets to the place of his crucifixion and burial. My life and faith has forever been changed by walking this sacred path.

Those who walk the Via Dolorosa are called pilgrims as they journey together in the steps of Jesus. The pilgrimage has been followed since early Christianity. You walk through the narrow cobblestone streets in the old city of Jerusalem that are lined with merchants who are all vying to get the attention of every tourist that passes their way. Many of the small shops are selling souvenirs to remember your journey. Some of them are selling food the fills the air with the spicy seasonings of the Middle East. It is busy and bustling place as thousands travel the route every day.



When I walk the route I imagine what it must have been like in Jerusalem 2,000 years ago. People filled the city to celebrate the Passover. Some estimate that a 1,000,000 people would come from all over the known world to meet in Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover. Merchants were seeking to lure the travelers into their shops. And on one Friday morning, three men are being led by Roman Soldiers to the hill just outside the city wall called Golgotha. They were to be crucified to teach everyone a lesson to not defy the Romans and the religious leaders of the Temple.

For many, it is no different than any other day, life goes on, things need to be bought and money needs to be made. Only God really knew the magnitude of what was happening on the day that would forever change the world. As I think about it, not much is different today. I remember a day when merchants closed at noon and churches were filled on Good Friday. When I was a boy, it seemed the whole world stopped to mourn Jesus' death. You could have shot a cannon down main street and not hit anyone! It was a sad day all the way around.

There are 14 Stations of the Cross along the route of the Via Dolorosa including four in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Many of the stations have tiny Chapels that allow you to step away from the noise and crowd for a quiet moment of prayer and reflection. You will understand when I say, "These were not peaceful moments" as I contemplate what Christ had endured for me and the world. It is truly the "way of sorrows" as many of my steps are blurred with tears as I pray and read the Bible passages detailing Good Friday. Being in the proximity of the original events, prayerfully reading the scriptures and reflecting upon them along the way touch me very deeply.


The cross is the most precious symbol of Christianity. On the cross, God's saving grace is revealed to us. As we move through this season of Lent, we are invited to "journey to the cross" and remember what Christ has done for us. I invite you to make your own pilgrimage that leads to the cross.

Step away from the busyness of your life to remember . . . Jesus.

Good Friday Worship


- Good Friday, March 30, 7:00 p.m.

Prayers to the Holy Land

One of the sites our Holy Land Travelers will be visiting is the Western Wall. The Western Wall had been called the Wailing Wall for many years. The Western Wall is actually a retaining wall built in 20 BC by Herod the Great to level the ground between two hills in Jerusalem: Moriah and Ophel. It created a plaza to build the second Temple. Ever since the second Temple was destroyed in 70 A.D., Jews have gathered in prayer at the Western Wall, and is considered their most holy place. Its cracks are filled with hand written prayers. Our group of travelers will be taking prayers from our congregation to the Western Wall. We will pray over the prayer requests while standing at the base of the wall, and place them in the cracks. There is a basket at the Welcome Center for you to place your prayers. All prayers will be held in confidence.

As time passes, it becomes harder to refer to our building project as "recent". We've been in the new spaces for about four years, now, and what a difference they have made! We would not be in this fortunate place if it had not been for the congregation's courageous leap of faith to move forward and build for the future.



In this weekend, you'll learn to see Christ in the world around you, and will be inspired to be an instrument of His love.



These Bibles normally sell for over \$20, but Cokesbury has made special arrangements for friends of the Women at the Well UMC to order them for only \$10. Use the special "Bibles for our Sisters"

Midwest Mission Distribution Center May 7-11

MMDC is a disaster relief facility located on an 8 acre campus, 4 miles south of Springfield, Illinois. MMDC is a cooperating depot in the UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) Relief Supply Network. MMDC's campus provides opportunities for individuals and groups of all walks of life, denominational backgrounds, abilities, and ages to help provide disaster relief kits and resources as well as educational and medical supplies to those in need both locally and internationally. MMDC provides that "hands on" mission experience without having to travel too far from home.

We have four spaces (2 rooms) reserved in the dorm at Midwest Mission Distribution Center for May 7-10 (returning home on May 11). Several people have expressed interest already. Cost per person is about \$140 for dorm and material fees, plus travel, sightseeing, and food costs. It's a fun way to do a little good, meet some new people, and get to know fellow travelers from First UMC better. See Lisa in the church office for more details about this mission opportunity.

"Hope for Harvey" Mission Trip - July 21-29

District Disaster Coordinators and Mission Team leaders from the North East and the East Central Districts of the Iowa Annual Conference are joining forces to send workers to the Rio Texas Conference of the UMC this summer. This is a work trip for ages Senior High to Senior Citizen. Travel by charter bus to Texas and back, but be prepared to sleep on church floors. Helpful skills to have would be carpentry, drywalling, painting, siding, construction, plumbing, or electrical work – but unskilled or semi-skilled assistants are also greatly appreciated. Cost to participate is \$450, and First UMC has funds to cover half of that expense. Registration deadline is May 7. There are information packets in the church office, or see Pastor Matt German if you are interested or have questions about the trip.

What is Stephen Ministry?

Since 2001, our church has had in place a care giving ministry called Stephen Ministry. This ministry is a way for congregations to provide high-quality care and outreach to hurting people in the congregation and the community.

Stephen Ministers are congregation members who go through 50 hours of Christian care giving training. Each Stephen Minister is then matched with a hurting person---men are paired with men, women with women---and meets with that person weekly to listen, care, pray, and encourage. Caring relationships last for as long as the need persists. The training they receive is also provided by members of our own congregation, Stephen Leaders, who have themselves received a week-long training in the skills they need to pass along instruction. It is important to note that our pastors and most of the staff here at First UMC have also taken the time to receive the training to assist them in their roles at the church.

Stephen Ministers care for those dealing with grief, divorce, job loss, hospitalization, financial struggles, loneliness, convalescence, terminal illness, and other life difficulties. We thank our congregation for their emotional and financial support of this important ministry.
