

### Learning to Pray

Lord, teach us to pray, was a request the disciples asked of Jesus. I have found myself pondering that request as we have journeyed through this sermon series on the Lord's Prayer, Thy Kingdom Come.

I asked myself, how did I learn to pray?

I learned the Lord's Prayer by sitting in church with my family. I remember two prayers from my childhood.

Our mealtime prayer, which was actually a sentence;

Come Lord Jesus, be our guest, and let these gifts to us be blessed. Amen

And our bedtime prayer.

Now I lay me down to sleep......

When I first started dating Gary, I was intrigued by their meal-time prayer. His father's heritage was Swedish, so they said a Swedish prayer, in Swedish. I was curious about the words, but Gary's father was our high school football coach and my driver education teacher, so I was too intimidated to ask. Finally, I got up the courage to ask Coach Nelson what the words meant, to which he replied, "I don't know."

We still laugh about that! My grandchildren actually looked up the prayer, on the internet of course, and found the translation.

I realized that what I learned about prayer as a young person, was the habit of prayer. To pray before a meal, to pray at night, to pray in church with others. That was a good thing to learn, and it has served me well.

How to pray is a whole other issue. A question that the disciples had the courage to ask Jesus.

We learn how to pray by listening to others pray, by reading the prayers of others. The Bible is full of people's prayers. And we learn how to pray by praying.

I once heard someone talk about praying the prayer that never fails, "Thy will be done." That is a good place to start!

So, it makes me wonder, how did you learn to pray? Might be a great conversation to have with someone!

#### UWF Meeting Summary Feb 8, 2024

The first meeting of 2024 was held with the program on Self Help International presented by Kassi Bailey, Deputy Director. Kassi just returned last week from a trip to Ghana to see their programs in action. Self help was started by an Iowa farmer to help alleviate hunger through improved farming practices. The group's mission was enhanced and bolstered by Norman Borlaug, another Iowan and Nobel Peace Prize recipient. Self Help International focuses their efforts in Ghana and Nicaragua. They improve the lives of people through 3 main programs; 1.) Empowering women through micro business Ioans and teen girls club, 2.) Improving agriculture through education and higher nutrient crops, 3.) Improving nutrition though education, clean water, and increasing use of higher nutrient foods especially in the first 1000 days of life. They employ and train local staff to assure culturally acceptable methods and messages. They will be having their Spring Gala fund raiser on April 18th and welcome help and attendance.

Maxine Kehret offered the response moment, Chris Werling offered devotions and Rus DeBonis gave the Call to Prayer and Self-denial.
