

"Generous persons will prosper; those who refresh others will themselves be refreshed." Proverbs 11:25 Common English Bible

A few years back I read a book entitled Deep Economy by Bill McKibben. It's intelligent writing so, I wasn't surprised to find out he's United Methodist. McKibben points out that we Americans are richer than generations ago, but we're not happier. We have more music, more education, more communication, and more entertainment, but it doesn't add up to happiness.

McKibben reveals that there's a certain point where more money does mean a happier life, but there's a point where that ends. He shares research that money consistently buys happiness right up to about \$10,000 per person and after that the addition of money doesn't bring huge amounts of more happiness. Once our needs are met, money just doesn't make us happier.

It seems that a single-minded focus on increasing wealth has driven us to the brink of failure, and all without making us happier. How did we get here?

I love the Harry Potter series of books and the movies too. There is a poignant moment in Harry Potter and the Secret Chamber. Harry and Professor Dumbledore were talking about the fact that Harry had many similarities to a Tom Riddle (whom Harry didn't want to be associated) Dumbledore says to Harry, "It is our choices, Harry, that show what we truly are, far more than our abilities."

And there lies the blame for how we got here, a focus on self or what McKibben refers to as hyper-individualism. Consider this:

75% of American Christians think the saying "God helps those who help themselves" can be found in the Bible. The saying is actually from Ben Franklin. And the Bible says pretty much the opposite. Every time Jesus tries to sum up his message he falls back on the formula "Love your God, and love your neighbor as yourself." (Bill McKibben. Deep Economy. 98.)

Jesus is forever saying that happiness is built around love of God and love of others. The generous life is to be focused on entering the joy of the Master, not on stockpiling more for ourselves, more than we need, more than is necessary. We would do well to remember that more is not always better. The truth is, enough is best, and practice the generous life.





Three Ten Connect

Here's an easy way to welcome our guests in Sunday worship: 3 ● 10 ● Connect.

It's simple: in the **first three minutes** after a worship service has ended, look around in a **tenfoot radius** and see if there's someone you don't know. If so, stick out your hand and say "hi". Make a little conversation. Ask them if they have any questions about our church, and if so, volunteer to introduce them to a pastor, a staff person, or someone you know to have the answer. Then, be sure to say that you, personally, are glad that they are here, and that you hope to see them again. It's that easy. **3 • 10 • Connect.**

First UMC Live Online

The whole world - including you - can watch our Sunday sermons live, online at our First UMC facebook page. The video stream for Transformation worship starts around 8:55, and the Traditional worship stream starts around 10:25. Please, if you can't make it in-person, consider watching on Facebook!

Also, be aware that this means there are live cameras in our worship spaces. Our cameras are usually positioned to show only the morning's speaker, but it is possible that the congregation may also appear in the livestream. If, for any reason you wish to ensure that you do not appear on-camera, please ask our camera operator for a safe place to sit.

For 40 years, lowa United Methodists have been gathering to share how they are working to address humanitarian problems here at home and around the world, including hunger, poverty, disease, and disaster.

At five sites around the state, United Methodists will gather all of the health kits, school kits, hygiene kits that they've made this year, and will celebrate all of the other missional projects in which we work for humanitarian causes worldwide. Our church, First UMC, Cedar Falls is one of those host sites. Join us on Saturday November 2.

You are invited to come to the Ingathering to see mission displays, hear a message from Midwest Mission personnel, enjoy lunch and get a great deal at the quilt auction. Check out the bazaar items and bake sale goods, too. You might just find a perfect Christmas gift for someone on your list.

At Ingathering, we gather in body and we also gather-in all of the school kits, health kits, birthing kits and hygiene kits



that we have made this year. We will pack them and load them for shipment to Midwest Mission Distribution Center.

MISSION: IMPOSSIBLE

We're about to do the possible - there's nothing "im" about it.

It's not the first time we've done the impossible. About ten years ago our congregation was frustrated by an aging facility which was a hindrance to our ministry goals. Our response to that frustration was to do the impossible: a huge construction project that touched all areas of our building. The project resulted in a church home that is more welcoming, more functional, more efficient, and safer than at any other time in our 170 year history. It was a project valued upwards of \$4 million dollars, and at its completion, we were left with a mortgage of \$1,400,000.

Since the end of construction, we've enjoyed our new and remodeled spaces, and we've done the nearly impossible task of reducing that loan to less than \$200,000 in just six years. This sets the stage for our next **MISSION: POSSIBLE**.

Our Mission, should we choose to accept it, is:

- Pay off our mortgage once and for all (this year or early next)
- Raise some additional funds for known needs (i.e. Fellowship Hall roof)

Here's the benefit

When our mortgage loan is paid in full we can move forward with a church budget that is directed toward today's ministries and tomorrow's dreams, instead of yesterday's debts. And, by raising more than we owe on the loan, we're creating a fund to tackle the next big building need, without having to ask you again for a special contribution in a year's time.

MISSION: POSSIBLE

We're boldly expecting success, and once we've written that final mortgage check, we'll have a mortgage burning party and you'll all get to light a match! As of this printing, the total left to pay on the mortgage loan is under \$100,000!

Question, Answer, Study, Lead

One way to challenge yourself and explore new areas of faith is to lead a short-term study group. We would love to fill our calendar with six to eight week bible studies and small groups. SoDA Volunteers

Would you be interested in becoming a Social Determinants Advocate (SoDA) Volunteer? A SoDA is a specially trained volunteer who works in a clinic or doctor's office to help patients who have identified some needs or barriers to staying healthy. Issues commonly identified are ability to afford medications, lack of transportation, of access to healthy food or services. The Social Determinants Advocates assist patients to navigate the system and connect with services that can help them. You don't have to have a healthcare background but it can help to have some familiarity with the health system. Martha Kroese currently works as a SoDA and can share her experience if you are interested. You would receive 15-18 hours of training, much of which focuses on community resources. Generally, the SoDAs are scheduled in the clinic once a week for about 3-4 hours at time.
