## **Celebrating All Saints**

We will celebrate All Saints Sunday on November 7th.

I want to suggest that All Saints Sunday is about honoring those who strove to be faithful stewards. Saints you know weren't perfect, but they all point us in a direction of the good life and reveal the image of God found in each saint. Have you ever wondered what it means to be born in God's image?

Familiar to most Christians (and many non-Christians too) is the verse from the gospel of John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

The verse reminds us about God's loving and generous character. "God so loved that God gave the Son..." First God loved and then God gave. Because of God's love, God gave us a generous gift, Jesus the Christ.

And when we pair this with what we learn from Genesis 1–that we were created in the image of God, we have a sense of our role as stewards. Because we were born with the characteristics of God, it follows that we were born to be loving and generous, too. We were created to give from a loving heart.

We are to be inherently loving and generous. Giving generously out of love is ingrained in us from our birth. We are all born to be generous. And in being stewards of a generous gift -the good life is found. For all that we have, and all that we are, we owe thanks to God.

On this All Saint's Sunday we gather around the table to remember and give thanks.

#### **Now Hear This!**

If you are one of the many people who live with hearing loss, don't let that stop you from attending worship. Our sanctuary is equipped with listening assistance devices. They are small, personal radios that pick up the pastor's microphones and amplify the signal for you. The radios plug into an earpiece (furnished), or you may bring your own headphones. Also, those with telephone-enabled hearing aids may request a wire "necklace" (T-Loop) that transmits the signal directly into the hearing aid - no headphones necessary! There is no charge to use these devices. If you'd like to try one of these devices, ask an usher, or talk to Chris, our First UMC Technical Director.

# Be a Blessing to Someone – Love INC

People in need will often approach a church for assistance. Unfortunately, many churches are not equipped to meet the variety of needs that are presented. That's not a failure of the churches - at their core, they are faith organizations, not relief agencies. But, the Christian imperative is to help. Love INC works like this: when someone approaches a member church for assistance, they are referred to Love INC. Love INC then conducts an interview to fully determine the need, and which church is best able to assist. Love In The Name of Christ (Love INC) pools the strengths of area churches and agencies to reach out to those in need - our church is one of over 30 that partner with Love INC..

You can be a blessing to someone today by volunteering with Love INC as a Clearinghouse or Community volunteer. If you're interested in serving with Love INC, fill out a volunteer form found at loveinccv.org or call 266-1264. They'll get back to you in the next couple of days.

#### **AARP Tax Aide program**

The AARP Tax Aide program could use some more local volunteers. This service provides free tax preparation for citizens, with an emphasis on providing services to low income and elderly populations., FUMC hosted one of the preparation sites last tax season, but there are also local sites at the Salvation Army and Westminster Presbyterian Church in Waterloo.

We need people who are willing to train as tax preparers, as well as people who will work as client facilitators and appointment schedulers. If you have basic computer skills, and don't mind talking on the phone, you would be able to work from home as an appointment scheduler. If you have good people skills and don't mind opening envelopes, and helping people fill out their questionnaires, you might make a good Client Facilitator. If you like numbers and detail, you can train as a tax counselor. All positions are volunteer. The tax preparation season begins around February 1 and runs until April 15. The time commitment is two half days a week during the season, plus training before tax season begins. Training for appointment scheduling takes just a couple of hours. Client facilitators have a couple of hours of training and will have to take a couple of on-line certification trainings. Tax counselor training and certification can also be done mainly online, and takes more time, depending on your prior experience with tax preparation.

#### **Help the Wee Ones**

Donate to our Wee Care closet. Grateful parents of wee ones come to our church every Tuesday afternoon to pick up a supply of much needed baby goods. This gap ministry through LoveINC helps struggling families in our own community stretch their dollars. Diapers of all sizes are always appreciated, along with wipes, baby wash, baby lotion, 8 oz bottles and sippy cups. If you see a good deal on end-of-season baby clothes feel free to bring them in. We have a place to store them until the appropriate season.

#### Got extra fabric? Bring it in!

There is always a need for durable/sturdy fabric to make school bags and other stitching projects. The Stitchers & Quilters also could use decent sized lengths of cotton quilting fabric for comfort quilts, baptism quilts, and quilts for foster kids, as well as school bags for Midwest Mission. There is a designated bin for your quality fabric donation in the church collection site on the main level of the church in the little hall across from the drinking fountain.



## The Giving Tree

November is a time of harvest and abundance, but not all of us are blessed with plenty. So, this month we have a variety of mission opportunities to assist those living in scarcity. This month's missions that we are supporting include Hospitality House, Love Inc.(Wee Care), Bibles for Women at the Well, Salvation Army and Heifer International. #### House of Hope:

This agency provides

- A permanent home for two years.
- Support and resources for finding work and/or completing an education.
- Child care.
- Transportation assistance.

#### Salvation Army

The Salvation Army gives out around 1300 bus passes each year to low income clients. This service helps people in the Cedar Valley get to work, school and to doctor appointments.

#### Heifer International

Heifer's mission is to work with communities to end hunger and poverty while caring for the Earth. Heifer does this by providing appropriate livestock, training and related services to communities of small-scale farmers worldwide.

#### Wee Care

The Wee Care ministry helps provide diapers and other baby items for those in the Cedar Valley who are in need of such items. This is a part of the Love INC ministries organization.

In order to make this new ministry work we need two more volunteers. Please reach out to Jenna Engel at jenna.engel@aboutfirst.com if you are interested in volunteering.


# Trunk or Treat was a Success!
