

It seems that when we accomplish one task, there is always a mile long list of others to complete. I have often times found myself growing weary this year. It feels like I have more to accomplish in a day then the hours I am provided with. I have heard this from several of you as well. We a so burdened with "stuff" to do, that many of us are on the brink of burn out. We have little time for leisure, family, and quiet time with God.



In the midst of a busy fall season, we need to remember that God is the author of all good things and is our source of strength. If we are feeling weary, it is because we are doing too much. Get a head start on the Mission Ingathering Quilt Auction. Bid on the "Stained Glass" Batik quilt in the Silent Auction in the Gathering Place. This quilt is 56" x 64" and is machine quilted. Put the Ingathering Quilt Auction date on your calendar – 1:00 pm November 2 in Fellowship Hall. The Quilters and Stitchers will have three antique quilts in the auction from donated pieced tops which they have quilted, some as old as the 1930's; a King size quilt – from donated embroidered squares – is hand quilted. Several smaller lap quilts pieced and machine quilted (sizes approximately 50"x60" to 60" x 70"), youth quilts, a baby quilt or two, wall-hangings, seasonal table toppers and table runners will be included in the auction as well as quilt items donated from other churches.

## MISSION: IMPOSSIBLE

We're about to do the possible - there's nothing "im" about it.

It's not the first time we've done the impossible. About ten years ago our congregation was frustrated by an aging facility which was a hindrance to our ministry goals. Our response to that frustration was to do the impossible: a huge construction project that touched all areas of our building. The project resulted in a church home that is more welcoming, more functional, more efficient, and safer than at any other time in our 170 year history. It was a project valued upwards of \$4 million dollars, and at its completion, we were left with a mortgage of \$1,400,000.

Since the end of construction, we've enjoyed our new and remodeled spaces, and we've done the nearly impossible task of reducing that loan to less than \$200,000 in just six years. This sets the stage for our next MISSION: POSSIBLE.

#### Our Mission, should we choose to accept it, is:

- Pay off our mortgage once and for all (this year or early next)
- Raise some additional funds for known needs (i.e. Fellowship Hall roof)
- Gather \$250,000 in cash and/or pledges by October 13

#### Is this Mission Possible? Absolutely. Here's how.

A group of very generous and future-focused First UMC families has already committed to provide a pool of funds which we are asking the rest of the church to match. Your matching funds, along with these early contributions, will add up quickly! This mission is fast-paced and short-term. We're looking for contributions and pledges which will be fulfilled yet this year, or the first quarter of 2020. We want to get this DONE.

#### Here's the benefit

When our mortgage loan is paid in full we can move forward with a church budget that is directed toward today's ministries and tomorrow's dreams, instead of yesterday's debts. And, by raising more than we owe on the loan, we're creating a fund to tackle the next big building need, without having to ask you again for a special contribution in a year's time.

#### MISSION: POSSIBLE

We're boldly expecting success, and once we've written that final mortgage check, we'll have a mortgage burning party and you'll all get to light a match!

## **Getting To Know Our Neighbors**

UMW Field Trip, Thursday, September 12th

In response to a Cedar Falls initiative called "Knowing Your Neighbor" that introduces Christian women's organizations to each other, our UMW Unit visited the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Approximately 30 women and youth hosted a visit by six of our ladies. We opened and closed the meeting in prayer. The youth welcomed us with their theme song from last year. A short presentation was given by their women's Relief Society. Lorna Ericson and Lisa Congdon described UMW and the United Methodist Church, respectively. We learned that both churches participate in a main service, known as a sacrament (communion) meeting. Further members sing hymns, pray and preach. We share a primary focus to support children, women, youth and families. We were blessed by a great discussion, refreshments and table decorations. 



## **Equipping Your Life of Ministry**

We hope you see your life as a personal ministry and your ministry can take many forms: sharing your story, serving others, preaching, leading, visiting, praying, and working.

The School for Lay Ministry is a program of the Iowa Conference of the United Methodist Church, designed to grow and equip new lay-leaders. Some of the ways that SLM graduates serve are: volunteer management, Christian education, care-giving, youth programming, outreach, pulpit supply, and the SLM is the pathway to becoming a Certified Lay Minister.

Students devote four weekends a year for three years to this program. Classes are held at the Cornell and Simpson colleges. Our own Pastor Scott Kober is an instructor for the School for Lay Ministry. There are reading assignments, lecture sessions, group discussions and activities. It's not for everyone - you have to want to do this - but if you do, you will end up having one of the most enlightening and empowering experiences in your Christian life.

Weekend courses will dig into worship, congregational care, Christian ethics, theological perspectives, missions, social concerns, church history, doctrine and polity and strategizing for growth. You will emerge equipped and inspired to see your life as a ministry and to share it openly in ways that suit your strengths and skills.

If you are curious about the School For Lay Ministry, talk to us in the church office and we can connect you with someone who has been - there are many in our congregation.

### **SoDA Volunteers**

Would you be interested in becoming a Social Determinants Advocate (SoDA) Volunteer? A SoDA is a specially trained volunteer who works in a clinic or doctor's office to help patients who have identified some needs or barriers to staying healthy. Issues commonly identified are ability to afford medications, lack of transportation, of access to healthy food or services. The Social Determinants Advocates assist patients to navigate the system and connect with services that can help them. You don't have to have a healthcare background but it can help to have some familiarity with the health system. Martha Kroese currently works as a SoDA and can share her experience if you are interested. You would receive 15-18 hours of training, much of which focuses on community resources. Generally, the SoDAs are scheduled in the clinic once a week for about 3-4 hours at time. - 2 receiving blankets (28"x28" to 32"x32")- no crib, fleece, or thermal blankets
