

Thoughts from Scott

"I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you." (2 Timothy 1:5)

The early church was wondering, as churches do today, how faith comes to be passed on from one generation to another. Today the same custom of passing on the faith exists, but to what degree? Many parents continue to ask, "Will my son or daughter be Christian? How can we pass on the faith to the next generation? How can we make the faith sticky-faith (faith that sticks throughout one's life)?"

There is no greater tool for faith formation then observation. We all learn a great deal by watching others, by looking over their shoulders as they actively live their faith. Timothy was raised in the Christian faith from childhood and is reminded of its importance in the letters Paul writes to him, but Timothy had more than a good upbringing. He had been given a calling. He was ordained by Paul's own hands we read, "I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline (2 Timothy 1:6, 7)." Paul was writing to Timothy that his faith mattered.

This fall First UMC will begin our **Confirmation classes** and one aspect of the process will be mentoring. Mentoring gives our youth a chance to look over the shoulder of another disciple. Further, this fall we will all be given the opportunity to explore our calling as disciples. This will happen as we explore together the worship series and church-wide study entitled "A Disciple's Path." I urge every member to take time to join in this study and worship series. It is my hope that we will encourage the faith of our Confirmation youth and the faith of our entire congregation as we explore together our call as a faith community "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

A Disciple's Path - Let's all look at this together!


The early Methodist ministers were itinerant travelers. They followed an actual path on horseback, to visit, encourage and teach small groups of believers, who often met in each other's homes.

And today, a piece of our Methodist understanding is that we're ALL ministers in one way or another – we're charged with sharing the Good News of the Gospel with those whose paths cross ours.

Times have changed since those early days, and our paths all look different – maybe your path is chasing your kids through the busyness of life, maybe your path is the hallway of your retirement community, maybe your path is the doorway you walk through to get to work, and maybe your path is the one you ride your bike on to unwind.

Regardless of what your path looks like, there are certain waypoints that we all have to hit as we pursue our purpose as ministers of the Gospel, they are: our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness. These waypoints aren't just ways to support our church, they're the ways we put our discipleship into action. These waypoints are what show us to actually be on *A Disciple's Path*.

A Disciple's Path – based on the book by James Harnish – is a practical and spiritual look at these essential waypoints. Pastor Scott and Pastor Matt invite you to join them on this church-wide journey and together we'll learn what it means to truly be a disciple of Jesus Christ from a United Methodist

- to commit yourself to pursue your personal ministry at a higher level


You should consider enrolling in the School for Lay Ministry (SLM). The School for Lay Ministry is an educational initiative of the Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, designed to grow Iowa churches by providing a supplemental source of leadership. Some of the ways that SLM graduates serve are: volunteer management, Christian education, care-giving, youth programming, outreach, pulpit supply, and the SLM is the pathway to becoming a Certified Lay Minister.

Students devote four weekends a year for three years to this program. Classes are held at the Cornell and Simpson colleges. Our own Pastor Scott Kober is an instructor for the School for Lay Ministry. There are reading assignments, lecture sessions, group discussions and activities. It's not for everyone – you have to want to do this – but if you do, you will end up having one of the most enlightening experiences in your Christian life.

Weekend courses will dig into worship, congregational care, Christian ethics, theological perspectives, missions, social concerns, church history, doctrine and polity and strategizing for growth. You will emerge equipped and inspired to see your life as a ministry and to share it openly in ways that suit your strengths and skills. In our congregation, Karl Dance, Jan Hoover, Jim Reidy, Chris Congdon, Lisa Congdon, Padma Templeton, Sue Ney, Chris Werling, Shane Waltz, Jon Cooper, and Tony John are graduates of the program, and Rus DeBonis is currently a student. Ask any of them about their experience, or talk to one of our pastors about the painless application process.

If you care deeply about the church, and you feel as though you have skills to offer in any area of ministry, the School for Lay Ministry is an outstanding experience to boost your personal confidence and leave you feeling empowered to pursue that ministry. You'll come away with a better understanding of our United Methodist Church's origin and structure, you'll earn where resources exist to help you and your church, and maybe most importantly, you'll bond with your classmates as you share your perspectives and experiences.

Bibles for our Sisters

A very tangible way we can help our sisters behind the razor wire is to provide Bibles for them. We have an opportunity to order new Bibles to be sent to the women's prison directly from Cokesbury. They are given to the ladies in Bible Studies and to keep for their own use. The Navigation Bible is an easy to read Bible and includes guidelines for effective Bible study. We have sent many Bibles to prison and they are treasured by those who receive them.

These Bibles normally sell for over \$30, but Cokesbury has made special arrangements for friends of the Women at the Well UMC to order them for only \$10. Use the special "Bibles for our Sisters" envelope at the display in the Gathering Place. You can take a look at the type of Bible that your \$10 will provide, too.

Christian Education offering - September 9

This offering is used in Iowa to celebrate and promote Christian education and spiritual formation. Half is granted to Iowa Religious Media Services for the purchase of resources, another large amount is used to support camperships at Iowa United Methodist Camps, and 10% is used to fund scholarships for continuing education for salaried United Methodist Christian Educators.

Our September Mission of the month is CROP Hunger Walk

The annual CROP Hunger Walk happens Sunday, September 30 (registration at 1:30, walk at 2:00). This year the walk will make a three mile loop beginning and ending at First Baptist Church in Waterloo (434 Baltimore St, Waterloo). 
