I remember my home church in Reynoldsburg, Ohio had a program called Life Center. Children dropped their parents off at the church for a day or part of a day. Life Center was directed by Fran McNew and was a day care for older adults.

You've never seen a person with more positive energy than Fran. You'd see her work with a woman who had a serious stroke and learning to walk again. And as the woman struggled across the floor, Fran was the type to say, "That's the way to go, Emma, come on, pull that foot out of the grave!"

How's that for a job description "assisting persons in pulling that one foot out of the grave." People need someone to tell them that they are not finished yet.

It's been a model for me over the years: drive out the despair and cynicism and loneliness and fear. Fact is it is not age related, I have talked with teenagers and I felt like saying: "Come on, pull that foot out of the grave."

Living in the present has to do with overcoming the shadows and despairs in life. It's about building God's future, believing in things that abide, acting out Faith, Hope and Love-pulling that one foot out of the grave. Do you still believe in the future?

If so, join me in pulling that foot out of the grave and living life to the fullest!

"Saving Grace: A Guide to Financial Well-Being"



This six-part resource leads individuals and their families in a comprehensive journey through earning, saving,

spending and giving all taught from a Christian perspective. This class will provide the tools you need to address the topics of saving, earning, giving, spending, and debt, along with helpful strategies for achieving a sustainable financial life.

Saving Grace is not a one-size fits all resource when it comes to finances. The program tries to address participants where they are in their careers, lifestyles and experiences with money. Financial well-being might look a little different for instance for the individual who works 9 to 5 every day in an office with benefits and a pension versus someone working within the gig economy. The workbook includes tips for creating a spending plan with a variable income.

Saving Grace also talks about debt realistically according to the needs of the person. "A lot of Christian resources out today tell you to avoid debt at all cost. Unfortunately, that is not always an option for all of us, especially among young people. Instead we help people discern when it's practical or necessary to take on debt and when to avoid it," said Rev. Anna Guillozet.

The six classes are led by Pastor Scott and begin Wednesday September 15 at 6:30pm - 7:30pm. Cost of participant book is \$12

New Worship Schedule Q & A's

Worship Times beginning September 12th!

The Worship Time Taskforce met 3 times April 27, May 19 and June 16 and reported to the Church Council on June 29th with following worship times. The Council voted the new times be implemented:

- 8:15 Sanctuary Worship
- 9:15 Transformation Worship
- 10:15 Sunday School for children and adults
- 11:15 Sanctuary Worship

Frequently Asked Questions

Why not the same worship times as before?

Due to the change in staff and the difficulty of staffing two services at 8:30 (both musical staff and Audio/Visual staff) it was the right time to consider a change.

How many services can we carry with new staffing?

Many churches have 3 or more services and 3 services was what we were used to offering. Our pastors and staff have experience with 3 services on a Sunday and feel it can be done effectively.

Where does Sunday School fit? How do we best serve children/families?

The desire to allow for a stand-alone Sunday School time was seen as an good offering for most families and children to participate. This gives family's an option of worship before or after the Sunday School time.

What if an adult Sunday School wants to meet at another time?

It will be encouraged that small groups (including Sunday School classes) can meet at alternative times that may work best for the group. A Sunday School class can meet at 9:15 if that works for the majority of the class.

Where is time for fellowship?

Fellowship time can still be offer beginning at 9am and ending at 11:15am.

What can the length of service be going forward? What is necessary in order of worship?

The Worship Design Team will be looking to create a 45 minute service for all 3 services. Therefore, we can expect a different look to the services but music and

preaching will be a high priority for all the services.

How will online and TV options be offered in future?

The online and TV options will continue to be offered. However, the 11:15am may not be offered as a live stream option in the beginning.

SWIM for Him

SWIM for Him International Ministries is our Mission of the Month for September

Safe Water International Ministries (SWIM) seeks to help people create safe drinking water while sharing the love of Jesus with them.

In many countries in the world, there is a critical need for safe water. Drilling more wells is not always the best option because these wells can still supply contaminated water, plus political, monetary, and location problems are sometimes insurmountable obstacles to safe water. SWIM produces and distributes a simple chlorine producing unit (CPU) that generates chlorine from salt and water. Since salt is usually readily available, when added to water, chlorine can be produced as needed without assistance from outside resources. The result is a natural chlorine solution that is safe and is an effective disinfectant, allowing safe drinking water

to be created. In addition to creating safe water - one CPU can provide for an entire village! - people are also told about Jesus.

Many people in remote areas are being reached by having their water needs being met - both physically and spiritually. They are introduced to safe water and to the Living Water in Jesus Christ.

This simple CPU (photo top) turns a puddle like (photo left) this into drinkable water. The CPU costs about \$100.00. Let's see if we can provide CPUs for 15 villages.
