Jesus looks at you, and loves you

I never noticed that before....

That is what I said to myself during my morning devotion.

I was reading from the book of Mark, chapter 10, verses 17-22. (check it out)

I was familiar with the story. A man came up to Jesus and asked what he needed to do to inherit eternal life. A short conversation followed between the two. Jesus reminded him of the commandments, which the man said he followed.

Here's what I never notice before, verse 21 begins this way, "Jesus looked at him and loved him."

Jesus looked at him, and loved him.

It was more than a conversation going on here, more than checking off a box on the to do list of "Things I must do to get to heaven."

Jesus saw the man. Jesus saw what it was that would keep this man from completely giving himself to follow Jesus. For this man, Jesus saw, it was his "stuff". His wealth, his possessions were getting in his way. Jesus saw that.

So here was the question I asked myself, you might want to ask yourself the same thing. When Jesus looks at me, when Jesus looks at you, is there an unhealthy attachment we might have that keeps us from completely following Jesus? It's not just about "doing" the right thing, it's about being right with Christ.

Jesus looked – and here's the part I missed before – Jesus loved. When he saw the man, it was out of his love for the man that Jesus revealed what it was in his life that needed to be put right. It was out of love that Jesus spoke.

It is out of love that Jesus reveals the areas in our lives that are holding us back.

Jesus looked at him, and loved him.

Jesus looks at me, and loves me.

Jesus looks at you, and loves you.

Here is my prayer. I pray that I have the courage to ask Jesus the hard questions about my own life and that as he looks at me with love, I will have the courage to let go of what holds me back and follow him. And I pray you have the courage to do the same.

SWIM for Him International Ministries

Safe Water International Ministries (SWIM) seeks to help people create safe drinking water while sharing the love of Jesus with them.

In many countries in the world, there is a critical need for safe water. Drilling more wells is not always the best option because these wells can still supply contaminated water, plus political, monetary, and location problems are sometimes insurmountable obstacles to safe water.

SWIM produces and distributes a simple chlorine producing unit (CPU) that generates chlorine from salt and water. Since salt is usually readily available, when added to water, chlorine can be produced as needed without assistance from outside resources. The result is a natural chlorine solution that is safe and is an effective disinfectant, allowing safe drinking water to be created.

In addition to creating safe water – one CPU can provide for an entire village! – people are also told about Jesus. Many people in remote areas are being reached by having their water needs being met – both physically and spiritually. They are introduced to safe water and to the Living Water in Jesus Christ.

Another FUMC Stephen Minister shares her journey:

I had thought of being a Stephen Minister but did not get signed up in time before my dad was diagnosed with ALS and passed away. I was blessed to have a Stephen Minister assigned to me who I could confide in when we first received the diagnosis and to help deal with the loss. The program helped me through a very difficult time. After experiencing the program, I knew that I wanted to help others (with God's help) with whatever they were going through and be that person

they could confide so I became a Stephen Minister. FUMC is very fortunate to have this program and I know that it will be a rewarding experience personally as well in your faith journey.

This next courageous testimony comes from one impacted by this ministry in our FUMC congregation: After trying to "handle life" (the feelings of frustration, shame, embarrassment, and failure as a parent) due to a family member who was wrapped up in an addiction to alcohol and prescription drugs, I tried to find help via Al-Anon. Although I attended several different meetings over several months, none of them seemed to be the right fit for me. I felt like I was falling down the "rabbit hole" with my loved one. It took a while before I gingerly shared my woes with a few close friends, and they suggested looking into the Stephen Ministry program. I wasn't 100% sure, but felt I was being led to try it. I am grateful to the person who became my Stephen Minister who listened, cared, and prayed for

me each time we met. Slowly the feelings of frustration, shame, embarrassment and failure ebbed, and I was able to heal and grow and enjoy life again. I will forever be grateful for the Stephen Ministry program and the people who give their time to make it happen.

New Fall Worship Schedule

Beginning Sunday, September 11, we will implement a new Sunday morning schedule:

- 8:30 Traditional Worship in sanctuary
- 9:15 Transformation Worship in Fellowship Hall
- 10:00 Sunday School
- 11:15 Traditional Worship in sanctuary

Our current schedule was implemented a year ago as we emerged from pandemic shutdowns. There were safety, technical, and staffing reasons for choosing that schedule, as well as a commitment to providing three worship opportunities and a dedicated Sunday school period. The Worship Design Team stated that congregational feedback would be accepted, and if necessary, the schedule may change in the future.

Well, your feedback has been heard – take a look at the new schedule above. You'll notice the first service will start a little later, reverting to its pre-pandemic 8:30 time. Transformation Worship will remain in its current 9:15 timeslot. The Sunday school period will move fifteen minutes earlier to 10:00, and the 11:15 service will also remain as-is. These are subtle changes, but they effectively shorten the time gap between the first service and Sunday school by 30 minutes.

This new schedule isn't perfect, and we'll continue to listen to your feedback. The Worship Design Team hopes that these changes make it easier for everyone to attend at the time they desire, and that gaps between services and classes have been reduced.

A year ago, as we exited pandemic restrictions, our current Sunday morning schedule was implemented with goals of:

- Having 3 Sunday morning worship options
- Maintaining enough time between services for complete turnover of air in worship spaces
- Not having concurrent worship services (a technical and staffing/volunteer issue)
- A dedicated Sunday School period

It was, and is, a lot to cram into a Sunday morning, and required shortening our worship services to 45 minutes.

Watch for updates in late September about any temporary location changes for services as we move forward with our Scott Hall renovations!

Sunday Live Stream is Moving!

Our Sunday morning live streams are moving to our church website, aboutfirst.com. Live streaming has allowed our worship services to be available, in real time, to people all over the world, and has become an important part of how we share our message. From the beginning, we have broadcast the live stream via Facebook, but that is about to change. Facebook can only receive one video stream at a time from First UMC. When

our service times change in September we will have overlapping worship services, resulting in two simultaneous live streams. Facebook can't do that, so we need to make a change.

Beginning Sunday, September 11, the Sunday morning live streams will be available at our website, aboutfirst.com. The live streams will no longer be available on Facebook.

What isn't changing:

Scott Fellowship Hall Refresh

Our Fellowship Hall, named in honor of Pastor Keith and Evelyn Scott, has served us well since its construction over two decades ago. In a regular weekly cycle of use, Fellowship Hall functions as a worship center, a dining room, a meeting space, and an indoor playground. While still very functional, the room is showing its age with stained, frayed, and gouged surfaces. Refreshing Fellowship Hall is the third and final stage in our Next Big Thing facility-improvement campaign and work is set to begin at the end of this month.

Here's the scope of the project:

- Some new paint on the upper portions of walls.
- New ceiling tiles for acoustic control
- Remove carpet on lower portions of walls and replace with painted, impact-resistant surface
- Remove existing carpet and replace with carpet squares in majority of the room, and hard surfaces in food-service areas.
- Remove flexible portion of stage and replace with a permanent structure.

A taskforce approved by Trustees has been working to choose materials and colors and plan a remodeling process which remains within the budget of the Next Big Thing campaign and minimizes down-time of this important space. The work will be done by a combination of paid contractors and First UMC volunteers. Roll up your sleeves, we're starting September 28.

The first step will be for a team of First UMC volunteers to strip the carpeting from the lower portions of the walls. We will begin on the morning of Wednesday, September 28. We need all available, able bodies to join us to get this stage done as quickly as possible. Bring whatever you think might help to strip the carpet off the walls: work gloves, utility knives, scrapers, etc.



Help the First UMC Mission!

So many wonderful missions are served by our Church. These include our internal outreach through our weekly church services, Wednesday night activities, Sunday School, our Quilters Club, Stephen Ministry activities, and many more. Paying our apportionments in full is a tradition our Congregation has embraced for decades. At the present time we are behind the budgeted amount. We should catch these up, and of course we do not want to scale back programming.

Please prayerfully consider how you can help. Might you be able to help by contributing an additional amount, maybe even a "13th" month of giving? If we all pitch in, we can get back on track to ensure the success of our valuable missions. As heard at a recent Sunday service – our generosity makes a real difference to real people! Please give prayerful consideration to how you might help.

Your Rummage Sale Donations at Work

We all have organizations we know that could use our help in both large and small ways. In this case I am speaking on behalf of Trees Forever, an Iowa based non-profit that works with communities in planting and managing their tree canopy among other things. One of their newer programs, Growing Futures, involves employing underprivileged teens in Des Moines and Cedar Rapids to plant trees especially in underserved neighborhoods and then keep them watered until they're established.

According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) the benefits of trees and vegetation in the landscape lowers surface and air temperatures by as much as 2-9 degrees F reducing the cost of energy. Air quality is improved and greenhouse gas emissions are also lowered.

Storm water runoff is absorbed and filtered improving the quality of our water. Even pavement maintenance is decreased with more shade.

Not least of all trees provide us with a sense of well-being. They help reduce noise and connect us to nature.

The teens hired by the Trees Forever Growing futures program understand the importance of the work they are doing. In addition to the salary they are making of \$12 an hour they are also trained in mentoring, creating resumes, job shadowing, and financial literacy. A meal is provided for them and that's where the rummage sale comes in. Office space has been donated to the Des Moines area group but had no cooking facilities. Through your donations I was able to purchase at a reasonable cost a griddle, Crock Pot, a George Foreman grill and a couple of other items to donate to them so some very hungry kids could have a variety of hot lunches.

This is just one more way your generosity goes far beyond our doors.
