UWF Unit Meeting Summary For April 2024

United Women in Faith met April 11th for their unit meeting. The program was presented by Mona Rottinghaus who is a volunteer leader for the Black Hawk Chapter of the National Alliance for Mentally III (NAMI). Our Local Chapter of NAMI provides free education and support groups for persons struggling with mental illness and their families. Mona became involved in the local NAMI chapter after her adult child was diagnosed with a severe mental illness and Mona felt she was unequipped to care for them. She says that women are often the family caregivers and may encounter anxiety associated with that role. She reviewed several simple tools and tips on mindfulness and ways to reduce anxiety. She also discussed mental wellness and specifically talked about the spiritual aspect of mental wellbeing. She spoke about how faith way key in helping her and her family come through their difficult ordeal. She credits answered prayer for the healing that came.

New Worship Schedule Begins this Summer

As we head into the summer season, we are launching a new Sunday morning worship schedule, beginning June 2.

- 8:30 worship traditional service in the sanctuary
- 9:30 fellowship time in Gathering Place will also be Sunday School time
- 10:30 worship contemporary service in Fellowship Hall

WHY:

Currently, our 8:30 and 9:15 services overlap by a few minutes. This is difficult for musicians, tech crew, and pastors who are expected to be in both rooms at the same time. Musicians and techs for 9:15 are not able to do pre-service sound checks. Pastors are not available for conversation with members before and after those two services. Also, those who attend our 8:30 service have an awkwardly long wait for Sunday School to begin. The current overlapping schedule has turned our 45 minute goal into a requirement, which constrains worship planning.

OUR HOPE:

This new schedule will give everyone some breathing room in their Sunday morning schedule. Pastors will be more available for conversation before, after, and between services. Musicians and technicians will have more time to fully finish one service, and adequately set up for the next. The fellowship and Sunday school time fits neatly between the two worship opportunities. And, worship planners will have the flexibility to extend services beyond 45 minutes on special Sundays.

EVALUATION:

This new schedule was proposed by the Worship Design Team, and approved by the Administrative Council in April. Current staff and pastors are in agreement with this change and incoming pastor Chad Jennings has offered no objection. We regret the loss of the 11:15 traditional service, but we believe this new schedule will help us to be more focused on each of the remaining services. Our church bus will begin serving the 8:30 service on June 2.

Worship Design Team has been wrestling with this change for over a year, and will continue to evaluate it at monthly meetings. The Team welcomes your feedback, both your initial reaction, and your ongoing opinion when we have lived with the new schedule for a few months. Let us know what you think!
